diminutive A diminutive word or suffix.
Diminutive in stature.

fancier	A person having a strong liking for something. <i>A pigeon fancier.</i>
<u>handful</u>	A quantity that fills the hand. <i>The kids could be such a handful.</i>
iota	The 9th letter of the Greek alphabet. <i>Nothing she said seemed to make an iota of difference.</i>
least	Used in names of very small animals and plants e.g. least shrew. <i>It is the least I can do.</i>
<u>less</u>	Lower in quality. <i>A shower uses less water.</i>
letter	Mark letters on or mark with letters. <i>He numbered and lettered the paragraphs.</i>
lilliputian	Small and of little importance. <i>A lilliputian chest of drawers.</i>
<u>literacy</u>	The ability to read and write. <i>Adult literacy programmes.</i>
little	Used in names of animals and plants that are smaller than related kinds e.g. little grebe. <i>What a nasty little situation.</i>
mini	Denoting a miniature version of something. <i>A mini camera.</i>
miniature	A copy that reproduces a person or thing in greatly reduced size. <i>Children dressed as miniature adults.</i>
<u>minimal</u>	Characterized by the use of simple forms or structures, especially geometric or massive ones. <i>A minimal charge for the service.</i>
<u>minor</u>	Of a key or mode based on a minor scale and tending to produce a sad or pensive effect. <i>Salinas was one of six teams in the minors.</i>
minuscule	Minuscule script. <i>A minuscule amount of rain fell.</i>
missive	A document in the form of a letter exchanged by the parties to a contract. <i>Yet another missive from the Foreign Office.</i>
peccadillo	A relatively minor fault or sin. <i>The sexual peccadilloes of celebrities aren't necessarily news.</i>

pettiness	Lack of generosity in trifling matters. <i>These awesome moments lift us above the pettiness of the world.</i>
pinprick	A minor annoyance or irritation. <i>Compared with the indignities he had so far endured this was a mere pinprick.</i>
puny	Of inferior size. <i>White faced puny children.</i>
remotely	In a remote manner. <i>A new type of remotely controlled torpedo.</i>
slight	A deliberate discourteous act (usually as an expression of anger or disapproval). <i>A Council determined whether the Fort should be kept or slighted.</i>
small	Have fine or very small constituent particles. <i>They are diehard conservatives with a small c.</i>
smattering	A slight superficial knowledge of a language or subject. <i>A smattering of snow.</i>
tiny	Very small. <i>A tiny hummingbird.</i>
trifling	Not worth considering. <i>A trifling sum.</i>
trivial	Concerned with trivialities. <i>A trivial young woman.</i>
undersized	Of less than the usual size. <i>The undersized cubs may not survive the winter.</i>
wee	(used informally) very small. <i>The lyrics are a wee bit too sweet and sentimental.</i>
