<b>administration</b>	The people responsible for running a business, organization, etc. <i>The oral <b>administration</b> of the antibiotic.</i>
<b>agency</b>	The state of being in action or exerting power. <i>The movies could be an <b>agency</b> moulding the values of the public.</i>
<b>bureau</b>	A writing desk with drawers and typically an angled top opening downwards to form a writing surface. <i>A news <b>bureau</b>.</i>
<b>department</b>	A specialized division of a large organization. <i>Baking is not my <b>department</b>.</i>

<b>evangelism</b>	The spreading of the Christian gospel by public preaching or personal witness. <i>I arrived in a state of high <b>evangelism</b>.</i>
<b>government department</b>	The study of government of states and other political units.
<b>holy orders</b>	A sacred place of pilgrimage.
<b>incumbency</b>	A duty that is incumbent upon you. <i>During his <b>incumbency</b> he established an epidemic warning system.</i>
<b>office</b>	Holding an office means being in power. <i>He rented an <b>office</b> in the new building.</i>
<b>period of office</b>	A unit of geological time during which a system of rocks formed.
<b><u>preaching</u></b>	The giving of moral advice in a pompously self-righteous way. <i>Your <b>preaching</b> is wasted on him.</i>
<b>teaching</b>	The activities of educating or instructing; activities that impart knowledge or skill. <i>Good classroom <b>teaching</b> is seldom rewarded.</i>
<b>term</b>	A statue or a human bust or an animal carved out of the top of a square pillar; originally used as a boundary marker in ancient Rome. <i>The <b>terms</b> of the treaty were generous.</i>
<b>term of office</b>	The end of gestation or point at which birth is imminent.
<b>the church</b>	A service conducted in a house of worship.
<b>the cloth</b>	Artifact made by weaving or felting or knitting or crocheting natural or synthetic fibers.
<b>the priesthood</b>	The body of ordained religious practitioners.

<b>apostle</b>	An important early Christian teacher or pioneering missionary. <i>An <b>apostle</b> of revolution.</i>
<b>believing</b>	The cognitive process that leads to convictions. <i>Seeing is <b>believing</b>.</i>
<b>bishop</b>	A chess piece typically with its top shaped like a mitre that can move in any direction along a diagonal on which it stands Each player starts the game with two bishops one moving on white squares and the other on black.
<a href="#"><u>bless</u></a>	Give a benediction to. <i><b>Bless</b> my soul Alan what are you doing.</i>
<a href="#"><u>christian</u></a>	Following the teachings or manifesting the qualities or spirit of Jesus Christ.
<a href="#"><u>church</u></a>	The body of people who attend or belong to a particular local church. <i><b>Church</b> a woman after childbirth.</i>
<b>clergy</b>	In Christianity clergymen collectively as distinguished from the laity. <i>All marriages were to be solemnized by the <b>clergy</b>.</i>
<b>coptic</b>	The liturgical language of the Coptic Church used in Egypt and Ethiopia; written in the Greek alphabet.
<a href="#"><u>curate</u></a>	A person authorized to conduct religious worship.
<b>dean</b>	An administrator in charge of a division of a university or college. <i>He is the <b>dean</b> of foreign correspondents.</i>
<b>deity</b>	The creator and supreme being (in a monotheistic religion such as Christianity). <i>A <b>deity</b> of ancient Greece.</i>
<b>diocesan</b>	The bishop of a diocese.
<b>diocese</b>	The territorial jurisdiction of a bishop.
<a href="#"><u>divinity</u></a>	Any supernatural being worshipped as controlling some part of the world or some aspect of life or who is the personification of a force. <i>Christ s <b>divinity</b>.</i>
<b>exchequer</b>	The funds of a government or institution or individual. <i>An important source of revenue to the sultan s <b>exchequer</b>.</i>
<b>holy</b>	Morally and spiritually excellent. <i>The <b>holy</b> month of Ramadan.</i>
<b>idyll</b>	An episode of such pastoral or romantic charm as to qualify as the subject of a poetic idyll. <i>The rural <b>idyll</b> remains strongly evocative in most industrialized societies.</i>

<b>ordination</b>	Logical or comprehensible arrangement of separate elements. <i>The <b>ordination</b> of women.</i>
<b>parish</b>	(in Louisiana) a territorial division corresponding to a county in other states. <i>A <b>parish</b> church.</i>
<b>pastor</b>	Be pastor of a church or congregation. <i>He continued to study law while <b>pastoring</b> in Chelsea.</i>
<b>pastoral</b>	Associated with country life. <i><b>Pastoral</b> land.</i>
<a href="#"><u>pray</u></a>	Address a prayer to God or another deity. <i>And what <b>pray</b> was the purpose of that.</i>
<a href="#"><u>priest</u></a>	Ordain to the priesthood. <i>He was made deacon in 1990 and <b>priested</b> in 1994.</i>
<b>protestant</b>	The Protestant churches and denominations collectively.
<b>rite</b>	Any customary observance or practice. <i>The <b>rite</b> of communion.</i>
<b>sacerdotal</b>	Of or relating to a belief in sacerdotalism. <i>Priestly or <b>sacerdotal</b> vestments.</i>
<a href="#"><u>temporal</u></a>	Characteristic of or devoted to the temporal world as opposed to the spiritual world. <i><b>Temporal</b> possessions of the church.</i>
<b>theologian</b>	A person who engages or is an expert in theology.
<b>theological</b>	Of or relating to or concerning theology. <i>A reworking of the past that was partly <b>theological</b>.</i>
<b>vicar</b>	(in other Anglican Churches) a member of the clergy deputizing for another.
