| <u>arcane</u> | Requiring secret or mysterious knowledge. <i>The arcane science of dowsing</i> . |
| attritional | Relating to or caused by attrition. |
| clique | An exclusive circle of people with a common purpose. His flat became a haven for a clique of young men of similar tastes. |
| convoluted | Highly complex or intricate and occasionally devious. <i>Convoluted reasoning</i> . |
| | Of an organ or body part diminished in size or strength as a result of disease or injury or lack of use. A diminished fifth. |



| esoteric | Confined to and understandable by only an enlightened inner circle. A compilation of esoteric philosophical theories. |

| jack | A steeplejack. You don t know jack . |
| <u>less</u> | (usually preceded by `no') lower in quality. <i>Cut out less important material.</i> |
| lilliputian | (informal) small and of little importance. Our worries are lilliputian compared with those of countries that are at war. |
| little | Used in names of animals and plants that are smaller than related kinds e g little grebe. <i>Filthy</i> little <i>tricks</i> . |
| mini | Denoting a miniature version of something. A mini camera. |
| <u>minor</u> | Of a key or mode based on a minor scale and tending to produce a sad or pensive effect. Jones minor . |
| <u>obscure</u> | Make obscure or unclear. The obscure light of dawn. |
| pettiness | Lack of importance or worth; triviality. These awesome moments lift us above the pettiness of the world. |
| pinprick | A prick caused by a pin. Compared with the indignities he had so far endured this was a mere pinprick . |
| puny | Inferior in strength or significance. <i>Puny excuses.</i> |
| <u>puzzle</u> | A jigsaw puzzle. She was puzzle d by the doctor s manner. |
| rarefied | (of air, especially that at high altitudes) of lower pressure than usual; thin. <i>Rarefied</i> scholarly pursuits. |
| recondite | (of a subject or knowledge) little known; abstruse. <i>The book is full of recondite information.</i> |
| reducible | (of a subject or problem) capable of being simplified in presentation or analysis. Shakespeare s major soliloquies are not reducible to categories. |
| <u>secretive</u> | (of a person's expression or manner) having an enigmatic or conspiratorial quality. A secretive smile. |



| shrinkage | Process or result of becoming less or smaller. Give long curtains good hems to allow for shrinkage . |

| shrinking | Becoming smaller in size or amount. The shrinking market has provoked a massive price war. |
| slight | Being of delicate or slender build. She was slight and delicate looking. |
| small | Have fine or very small constituent particles. <i>Her comments made me feel small</i> . |
| tiny | A very young child. A tiny hummingbird. |
| trifling | The deliberate act of delaying and playing instead of working. <i>A trifling sum.</i> |
| <u>trivia</u> | Something of small importance. We fill our days with meaningless trivia . |
| undersized | Of less than the usual size. |
