- *A marvellous event manifesting a supernatural act of a divine agent.*
- *An extraordinary and welcome event that is not explicable by natural or scientific laws and is therefore attributed to a divine agency.*
- *A remarkable event or development that brings very welcome consequences.*
- *Any amazing or wonderful occurrence.*



Synonyms of "Miracle" as a noun (8 Words)

marvel

A wonderful or astonishing person or thing.
*The **marvels** of technology.*

mystery

A story about a crime (usually murder) presented as a novel or play or movie.
*A **mystery** guest.*

phenomenon

The object of a person's perception.
*The band was a pop **phenomenon** just for their sales figures alone.*

prodigy

An unusually gifted or intelligent (young) person; someone whose talents excite wonder and admiration.
*She is a chess **prodigy**.*

sensation

The capacity to have physical sensations.
*The news caused a **sensation**.*

- ascension** The action of rising to an important position or a higher level.
His ascension to the presidency.
- conundrum** A question asked for amusement, typically one with a pun in its answer; a riddle.
One of the most difficult conundrums for the experts.
- cryptogram** A piece of writing in code or cipher.
- cure** A substance or treatment that cures a disease or condition.
Cure pickles.

| <u>mystic</u> | Relating to or resembling mysticism. <i>Mystical intuition.</i> |
| <u>occult</u> | Supernatural forces and events and beings collectively. <i>The beam of light occults every so often.</i> |
| panacea | The goddess of healing; daughter of Aesculapius and sister of Hygeia. <i>The panacea for all corporate ills.</i> |
| <u>paradise</u> | Any place of complete bliss and delight and peace. <i>My idea of paradise is to relax on the seafront.</i> |
| <u>potion</u> | A medicinal or magical or poisonous beverage. <i>A healing potion.</i> |
| preternatural | Existing outside of or not in accordance with nature-Aldous Huxley. <i>Beyond his preternatural affability there is some acid and some steel.</i> |
