- *A remarkable event or development that brings very welcome consequences.*
- *Any amazing or wonderful occurrence.*



## Synonyms of "Miracle" as a noun (8 Words)

### marvel

A wonderful or astonishing person or thing.

*The **marvels** of technology.*

### mystery

A story about a crime (usually murder) presented as a novel or play or movie.

*A **mystery** guest.*

### phenomenon

The object of a person's perception.

*The band was a pop **phenomenon** just for their sales figures alone.*

### prodigy

An unusually gifted or intelligent (young) person; someone whose talents excite wonder and admiration.

*She is a chess **prodigy**.*

### sensation

The capacity to have physical sensations.

*The news caused a **sensation**.*

<b>sign</b>	A fundamental linguistic unit linking a signifier to that which is signified de Saussure. <i>The bond between the <b>signifier</b> and the <b>signified</b> is arbitrary.</i>
<b>supernatural phenomenon</b>	Supernatural forces and events and beings collectively.
<b>wonder</b>	A thing or a quality of something that causes wonder. A <b>wonder</b> drug.



## Usage Examples of "Miracle" as a noun

- *A machine which was a miracle of design.*
- *It was a miracle that more people hadn't been killed.*
- *Industries at the heart of the economic miracle.*
- *The miracle of rising from the grave.*
- *A miracle drug.*

- arcane** Understood by few; mysterious or secret.  
*Arcane* procedures for electing people.
- ascension** The action of rising to an important position or a higher level.  
*His ascension* to the presidency.
- conundrum** A question asked for amusement, typically one with a pun in its answer; a riddle.  
*One of the most difficult conundrums* for the experts.
- cryptogram** A piece of writing in code or cipher.
- cure** A substance or treatment that cures a disease or condition.  
*Cure* pickles.

<b>disbelieve</b>	Reject as false; refuse to accept. <i>To <b>disbelieve</b> is as much an act of faith as belief.</i>
<b>economic</b>	Of or relating to the science of economics. <i>Solar power may provide a more <b>economic</b> solution.</i>
<b>elixir</b>	A magical or medicinal potion. <i>At one point during the festivities the river is said to turn into the <b>elixir</b> of life.</i>
<b><u>enigma</u></b>	A person or thing that is mysterious or difficult to understand. <i>Madeleine was still an <b>enigma</b> to him.</i>
<b>healing</b>	Tending to cure or restore to health. <i>The <b>healing</b> process.</i>
<b>heaven</b>	The sky, especially perceived as a vault in which the sun, moon, stars, and planets are situated. <i>Those who practised good deeds would receive the reward of a place in <b>heaven</b>.</i>
<b>idle</b>	Be idle exist in a changeless situation. <i>The machinery sat <b>idle</b> during the strike.</i>
<b>immortality</b>	The quality of deserving to be remembered for a long time; timelessness. <i>Occasionally a guide book has achieved <b>immortality</b>.</i>
<b>magic</b>	An illusory feat considered magical by naive observers. <i>His parents bought him a <b>magic</b> set for Christmas.</i>
<b><u>mystery</u></b>	The practices, skills, or lore peculiar to a particular trade or activity and regarded as baffling to those without specialized knowledge. <i>What happened after he left home that day remains a <b>mystery</b>.</i>
<b><u>mystic</u></b>	Relating to or resembling mysticism. <i><b>Mystical</b> intuition.</i>
<b><u>occult</u></b>	Supernatural forces and events and beings collectively. <i>The beam of light <b>occults</b> every so often.</i>
<b>panacea</b>	The goddess of healing; daughter of Aesculapius and sister of Hygeia. <i>The <b>panacea</b> for all corporate ills.</i>
<b><u>paradise</u></b>	Any place of complete bliss and delight and peace. <i>My idea of <b>paradise</b> is to relax on the seafront.</i>
<b><u>potion</u></b>	A medicinal or magical or poisonous beverage. <i>A healing <b>potion</b>.</i>
<b>preternatural</b>	Existing outside of or not in accordance with nature-Aldous Huxley. <i>Beyond his <b>preternatural</b> affability there is some acid and some steel.</i>

<b>puzzle</b>	A jigsaw puzzle. <i>The meaning of the poem has always been a <b>puzzle</b>.</i>
<b>resurrection</b>	(in Christian belief) the rising of Christ from the dead. <i>The <b>resurrection</b> of the country under a charismatic leader.</i>
<b>resuscitated</b>	Restored to life or consciousness.
<b>revival</b>	Bringing again into activity and prominence. <i>A wave of religious <b>revival</b>.</i>
<b>riddle</b>	Explain a riddle. <i><b>Riddle</b> me this then.</i>
<b>solve</b>	Settle, as of a debt. <i>Did you <b>solve</b> the problem.</i>
<b>sorcery</b>	The use of magic, especially black magic.
<b>supernatural</b>	Supernatural forces and events and beings collectively. <i>A woman of <b>supernatural</b> beauty.</i>
<b>worker</b>	A neuter or undeveloped female bee, wasp, ant, or other social insect, large numbers of which do the basic work of the colony. <i><b>Workers</b> of the world unite.</i>
