

A difficult or unpleasant situation.

Debt ridden farmers struggling with adversity.

bad luck That which is below standard or expectations as of ethics or decency.

An act of blowing an instrument.

A blow on the head.

A factor causing trouble in achieving a positive result or tending to

difficulty produce a negative result.

There is a practical **difficulty**.

issue Supplies as food or clothing or ammunition issued by the government.

A point of **issue**.

The coroner recorded a verdict of death by **misadventure**.

An instance of misfortune. mischance

Innumerable **mischance**s might ruin the enterprise.

An unfortunate state resulting from unfavorable outcomes. misfortune

Denoting or relating to people whose behaviour causes difficulties to

themselves and others. problem

What s the **problem**.

Reverse gear on a motor vehicle the position of a gear lever or selector

reverse corresponding to this.

He didn t feel homesick quite the **reverse**.

An unfortunate happening that hinders or impedes; something that is reverse of fortune

thwarting or frustrating.

A reversal or check in progress. setback

A serious **setback** for the peace process.

stroke of bad luck The maximum movement available to a pivoted or reciprocating piece by a cam.

A situation in which one is liable to incur punishment or blame. trouble

Friends should support each other when they are in trouble.








Usage Examples of "Mishap" as a noun

Resilience in the face of **adversity**.

beset Assail or attack on all sides.

She was beset with self doubt.

betide Become of; happen to.

cataclysm An event resulting in great loss and misfortune.

The **cataclysm** at the end of the Cretaceous Period.

catastrophe The denouement of a drama, especially a classical tragedy.

The tax would be a **catastrophe** for the industry.

damage Suffer or be susceptible to damage.

The car was badly **damage**d in the accident.

destroyed Destroyed physically or morally.

Alzheimer s is responsible for her **destroyed** mind.

disaster An event or fact that has unfortunate consequences.

A string of personal **disaster**s.

A sudden violent shaking of the ground, typically causing great destruction,

earthquake as a result of movements within the earth's crust or volcanic action.

Selling the company caused an **earthquake** among the employees.

Something hard to endure.

hardship I cannot think it a **hardship** that more indulgence is allowed to men than to

women.

harry Persistently carry out attacks on (an enemy or an enemy's territory.

The raiders then spent three months **harry**ing and burning the area.

Destroyed or killed.
