- An instance of misfortune.






Synonyms of "Mishap" as a noun (15 Words)

<u>accident</u>	Anything that happens suddenly or by chance without an apparent cause. It is no accident that Manchester has produced more than its fair share of professional comics.
adversity	A difficult or unpleasant situation. Debt ridden farmers struggling with adversity .
bad luck	That which is below standard or expectations as of ethics or decency.
blow	An act of blowing an instrument. A blow on the head.
difficulty	A factor causing trouble in achieving a positive result or tending to produce a negative result. <i>There is a practical difficulty</i> .
issue	Supplies as food or clothing or ammunition issued by the government. <i>A point of issue</i> .



misadventure	An unfortunate incident; a mishap. The coroner recorded a verdict of death by misadventure .
mischance	An instance of misfortune. Innumerable mischance s might ruin the enterprise.
<u>misfortune</u>	An unfortunate state resulting from unfavorable outcomes. <i>The project was dogged by misfortune</i> .
problem	Denoting or relating to people whose behaviour causes difficulties to themselves and others. What s the problem .
reverse	Reverse gear on a motor vehicle the position of a gear lever or selector corresponding to this. <i>He didn t feel homesick quite the reverse.</i>
reverse of fortune	An unfortunate happening that hinders or impedes; something that is thwarting or frustrating.
setback	A reversal or check in progress. A serious setback for the peace process.
stroke of bad luck	The maximum movement available to a pivoted or reciprocating piece by a cam.
trouble	A situation in which one is liable to incur punishment or blame. Friends should support each other when they are in trouble .








Usage Examples of "Mishap" as a noun

- Although there were a few minor mishaps, none of the pancakes stuck to the ceiling.
- The event passed without mishap.



Associations of "Mishap" (30 Words)

An incidence of incontinence by a child or animal. <i>The pregnancy was an accident</i> .
A difficult or unpleasant situation. <i>Resilience in the face of adversity.</i>
Appear as a character on stage or appear in a play etc. <i>He suddenly</i> appear ed at the wedding.
Happen, occur, or be the case in the course of events or by chance. <i>He promised that no harm would befall her.</i>



<u>beset</u>	Assail or attack on all sides. She was beset with self doubt.
betide	Become of; happen to. She was trembling with fear lest worse might betide her.
blow	Of a whale eject air and vapour through the blowhole. This blow s she sighs I want it to be next week already.
breakdown	A mental or physical breakdown. A breakdown in military discipline.
<u>calamity</u>	An event causing great and often sudden damage or distress; a disaster. The whole city was affected by the irremediable calamity .
cataclysm	An event resulting in great loss and misfortune. The cataclysm at the end of the Cretaceous Period.
catastrophe	The denouement of a drama, especially a classical tragedy. The tax would be a catastrophe for the industry.
damage	Suffer or be susceptible to damage. The car was badly damage d in the accident.
destroyed	Destroyed physically or morally. Alzheimer s is responsible for her destroyed mind.
disaster	An event or fact that has unfortunate consequences. A string of personal disaster s.
<u>earthquake</u>	A sudden violent shaking of the ground, typically causing great destruction, as a result of movements within the earth's crust or volcanic action. <i>Selling the company caused an earthquake among the employees.</i>
hardship	Something hard to endure. <i>I cannot think it a hardship that more indulgence is allowed to men than to women.</i>
harry	Persistently carry out attacks on (an enemy or an enemy's territory. The raiders then spent three months harry ing and burning the area.
kaput	Destroyed or killed. <i>The water pump s broken kaput.</i>
malfunction	(of a piece of equipment or machinery) fail to function normally. A computer malfunction .
misadventure	Death caused by a person accidentally while performing a legal act without negligence or intent to harm. The petty misdemeanours and misadventure s of childhood.
mischance	An unlucky occurrence. Innumerable mischance s might ruin the enterprise.



<u>misfortune</u>	Unnecessary and unforeseen trouble resulting from an unfortunate event. <i>The project was dogged by misfortune</i> .
<u>needy</u>	Needy people collectively. The provision of humanitarian assistance to the needy .
ruined	Destroyed physically or morally. A ruined castle.
suffering	Psychological suffering. <i>Suffering</i> refugees.
<u>tragedy</u>	Drama in which the protagonist is overcome by some superior force or circumstance; excites terror or pity. <i>Greek tragedy</i> .
trouble	Take the trouble to do something concern oneself. <i>He got several girls in trouble.</i>
<u>unfortunate</u>	Not auspicious; boding ill. His unfortunate remark silenced the gathering.
unfortunately	By bad luck. Unfortunately we do not have the time to interview every applicant.
unlucky	Marked by or promising bad fortune- W.H.Prescott. An unlucky defeat.
