Definitions of "Mismatch" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “mismatch” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A bad or unsuitable match.*
- *An unequal or unfair sporting contest.*
- *A failure to correspond or match; a discrepancy.*



Synonyms of "Mismatch" as a noun (12 Words)

bad match	That which is below standard or expectations as of ethics or decency.
conflict	An open clash between two opposing groups (or individuals)-Thomas Paine. <i>He was immobilized by conflict and indecision.</i>
<u>contradiction</u>	The speech act of contradicting someone. <i>The proposed new system suffers from a set of internal contradictions.</i>
<u>discord</u>	A chord which (in conventional harmonic terms) is regarded as unpleasing or requiring resolution by another. <i>A prosperous family who showed no signs of discord.</i>
discrepancy	An illogical or surprising lack of compatibility or similarity between two or more facts. <i>There s a discrepancy between your account and his.</i>

incongruity	The state of being incongruous; incompatibility. <i>The incongruity of his fleshy face and skinny body disturbed her.</i>
incongruousness	The quality of disagreeing; being unsuitable and inappropriate. The relation between propositions that cannot both be true at the same time. <i>The incongruity between his expressed attitudes and his actual behaviour.</i>
lack of congruence	The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.
misalliance	An unsuitable alliance (especially with regard to marriage). <i>It s no good blaming yourself it was a hopeless misalliance.</i>
mismatch	An unsuitable marriage or alliance.
mésalliance	A marriage with a person of inferior social status.



Usage Examples of "Mismatch" as a noun

- *There are fewer mismatches so spectators get better value for money.*
- *A huge mismatch between supply and demand.*
