| jingoism | Fanatical patriotism. <i>The popular jingoism that swept the lower middle classes.</i> |
| misogynism | Misogyny. |
| racialism | Discriminatory or abusive behavior towards members of another race. |

| racism | Prejudice, discrimination, or antagonism by an individual, community, or institution against a person or people on the basis of their membership of a particular racial or ethnic group, typically one that is a minority or marginalized. <i>Theories of racism.</i> |
| sectarianism | Excessive attachment to a particular sect or party, especially in religion. <i>Religious sectarianism.</i> |
| xenophobia | Dislike of or prejudice against people from other countries. <i>The resurgence of racism and xenophobia.</i> |

| abomination | An action that is vicious or vile; an action that arouses disgust or abhorrence. <i>His treatment of the children is an abomination.</i> |
| acrimony | A rough and bitter manner. <i>The AGM dissolved into acrimony.</i> |
| ageism | Discrimination on the basis of a person's age. <i>Ageism in recruitment is an increasing problem.</i> |
| animosity | Strong hostility. <i>He no longer felt any animosity towards her.</i> |
| aversion | A feeling of intense dislike. <i>They made plain their aversion to the use of force.</i> |
| bigot | A person who is obstinately or unreasonably attached to a belief, opinion, or faction, especially one who is prejudiced against or antagonistic towards a person or people on the basis of their membership of a particular group. <i>A racist bigot.</i> |
| detestation | Intense dislike. <i>Wordsworth's detestation of aristocracy.</i> |
| detested | Treated with dislike or contempt. |

- disapproving** Expressing or manifesting disapproval.
*He shot a **disapproving** glance at her.*
- discrimination** The selection of a signal having a required characteristic, such as frequency or amplitude, by means of a discriminator.
***Discrimination** learning.*
- discriminatory** Making or showing an unjust or prejudicial distinction between different categories of people, especially on the grounds of ethnicity, sex, age, or disability.
***Discriminatory** employment practices.*
- dislike** Have or feel a dislike or distaste for.
*She **disliked** any kind of unnecessary rudeness.*
- gender** In languages such as Latin French and German each of the classes typically masculine feminine common neuter of nouns and pronouns distinguished by the different inflections which they have and which they require in words syntactically associated with them Grammatical gender is only very loosely associated with natural distinctions of sex.
*I m a strong believer that **gender** is fluid.*
- grievance** An allegation that something imposes an illegal obligation or denies some legal right or causes injustice.
*A website which enabled staff to air their **grievances**.*
- harassment** Aggressive pressure or intimidation.
*So great was his **harassment** that he wanted to destroy his tormentors.*
- hate** The emotion of intense dislike; a feeling of dislike so strong that it demands action.
*I **hate** Mexican food.*
- hatred** The emotion of intense dislike; a feeling of dislike so strong that it demands action.
*Racial **hatred**.*
- injustice** An unjust act or occurrence.
*Brooding over life s **injustices**.*
- jaundiced** Affected by bitterness, resentment, or cynicism.
*They looked on politicians with a **jaundiced** eye.*
- loathing** A feeling of intense dislike or disgust; hatred.
*The thought filled him with **loathing**.*
- misanthrope** Someone who dislikes people in general.
*Scrooge wasn t the mean spirited **misanthrope** most of us believe him to be.*

| misanthropic | Believing the worst of human nature and motives; having a sneering disbelief in e.g. selflessness of others. <i>With his misanthropic outlook he was an ugly character.</i> |
| misogynist | Relating to or characteristic of a misogynist. <i>A bachelor and renowned misogynist.</i> |
| odium | General or widespread hatred or disgust incurred by someone as a result of their actions. <i>He incurred widespread odium for military failures and government corruption.</i> |
| patriarchy | A society or community organized on patriarchal lines. <i>The thematic relationships of the ballad are worked out according to the conventional archetypes of the patriarchy.</i> |
| prejudiced | Having or showing a dislike or distrust that is derived from prejudice; bigoted. <i>A prejudiced judge.</i> |
| racism | Discriminatory or abusive behavior towards members of another race. <i>Theories of racism.</i> |
| racist | Characterized by or showing prejudice, discrimination, or antagonism against a person or people on the basis of their membership of a particular racial or ethnic group, typically one that is a minority or marginalized. <i>He has been targeted by vicious racists online.</i> |
| sexism | Prejudice, stereotyping, or discrimination, typically against women, on the basis of sex. <i>Sexism in language is an offensive reminder of the way the culture sees women.</i> |
