barring	The act of excluding someone by a negative vote or veto.
besides	Used to introduce an additional idea or explanation. <i>I don't want to go to a restaurant besides we can't afford it.</i>
by	In reserve; not for immediate use. <i>Put something by for her old age.</i>
bygone	Past events to be put aside. <i>Let bygones be bygones.</i>
decriminalize	Make legal. <i>A battle to decriminalize cannabis.</i>
defeatist	Demonstrating expectation or acceptance of failure. <i>We have a duty not to be so defeatist.</i>
disappearance	An act or the fact of someone or something going missing. <i>What was responsible for the disappearance of the rainforest.</i>
elimination	The act of removing an unknown mathematical quantity by combining equations. <i>A condensation reaction can link together two monosaccharide sugars to form a disaccharide with the elimination of water.</i>
except	Take exception to. <i>Five classes of advertisement are excepted from control.</i>
exclude	Prevent from being included or considered or accepted. <i>The cost for the trip excludes food and beverages.</i>
foregone	Past. <i>Dreams of foregone times.</i>
gone	No longer in existence; dead or extinct. <i>Spending time and effort on a gone sucker like Galindez.</i>
homesick	Longing to return home. <i>He was homesick for America after five weeks in Europe.</i>

hometown	The town (or city) where you grew up or where you have your principal residence. <i>He never went back to his hometown again.</i>
leave	Go and leave behind either intentionally or by neglect or forgetfulness. <i>Leave your child in the nurse s care.</i>
longing	Prolonged unfulfilled desire or need. <i>Miranda felt a wistful longing for the old days.</i>
lose	Miss from one s possessions lose sight of. <i>Lose that creep.</i>
misfire	Fail to fire or detonate. <i>The guns misfired.</i>
mislaid	Unintentionally put (an object) where it cannot readily be found and so lose it temporarily. <i>I seem to have mislaid my car keys.</i>
missing	Not able to be found. <i>You can fill in the missing details later.</i>
neglect	The state of something that has been unused and neglected. <i>She was accused of child neglect.</i>
obviate	Remove (a need or difficulty). <i>The presence of roller blinds obviated the need for curtains.</i>
omission	Neglecting to do something; leaving out or passing over something. <i>To pay compensation for a wrongful act or omission.</i>
omit	Leave undone or leave out. <i>He modestly omits to mention that he was a pole vault champion.</i>
overlook	A high place affording a good view. <i>It s better if the property isn t overlooked.</i>
repent	Feel or express sincere regret or remorse about one s wrongdoing or sin. <i>Marian came to repent her hasty judgement.</i>
rue	A street or road in France. <i>With rue my heart is laden.</i>
unabridged	A dictionary that has not been shortened by the omitting terms or definitions; a comprehensive dictionary. <i>An unabridged novel.</i>
unshared	Not shared. <i>Most of those placed in hostels would prefer unshared independent accommodation.</i>
