## Associations of "Miss out" (30 Words)

<b>barring</b>	The act of excluding someone by a negative vote or veto.
<b>besides</b>	Used to introduce an additional idea or explanation. <i>I don't want to go to a restaurant <b>besides</b> we can't afford it.</i>
<b>by</b>	In reserve; not for immediate use. <i>Put something <b>by</b> for her old age.</i>
<b>bygone</b>	Past events to be put aside. <i>Let <b>bygones</b> be <b>bygones</b>.</i>
<b>decriminalize</b>	Make legal. <i>A battle to <b>decriminalize</b> cannabis.</i>
<b>defeatist</b>	Demonstrating expectation or acceptance of failure. <i>We have a duty not to be so <b>defeatist</b>.</i>
<b>disappearance</b>	An act or the fact of someone or something going missing. <i>What was responsible for the <b>disappearance</b> of the rainforest.</i>
<b>elimination</b>	The act of removing an unknown mathematical quantity by combining equations. <i>A condensation reaction can link together two monosaccharide sugars to form a disaccharide with the <b>elimination</b> of water.</i>
<b>except</b>	Take exception to. <i>Five classes of advertisement are <b>excepted</b> from control.</i>
<b>exclude</b>	Prevent from being included or considered or accepted. <i>The cost for the trip <b>excludes</b> food and beverages.</i>
<b>foregone</b>	Past. <i>Dreams of <b>foregone</b> times.</i>
<b>gone</b>	No longer in existence; dead or extinct. <i>Spending time and effort on a <b>gone</b> sucker like Galindez.</i>
<b>homesick</b>	Longing to return home. <i>He was <b>homesick</b> for America after five weeks in Europe.</i>

<b>hometown</b>	The town (or city) where you grew up or where you have your principal residence. <i>He never went back to his <b>hometown</b> again.</i>
<b>leave</b>	Go and leave behind either intentionally or by neglect or forgetfulness. <i><b>Leave</b> your child in the nurse s care.</i>
<b>longing</b>	Prolonged unfulfilled desire or need. <i>Miranda felt a wistful <b>longing</b> for the old days.</i>
<b>lose</b>	Miss from one s possessions lose sight of. <i><b>Lose</b> that creep.</i>
<b>misfire</b>	Fail to fire or detonate. <i>The guns <b>misfired</b>.</i>
<b>mislaid</b>	Unintentionally put (an object) where it cannot readily be found and so lose it temporarily. <i>I seem to have <b>mislaid</b> my car keys.</i>
<b>missing</b>	Not able to be found. <i>You can fill in the <b>missing</b> details later.</i>
<b>neglect</b>	The state of something that has been unused and neglected. <i>She was accused of child <b>neglect</b>.</i>
<b>obviate</b>	Remove (a need or difficulty). <i>The presence of roller blinds <b>obviated</b> the need for curtains.</i>
<b>omission</b>	Neglecting to do something; leaving out or passing over something. <i>To pay compensation for a wrongful act or <b>omission</b>.</i>
<b>omit</b>	Leave undone or leave out. <i>He modestly <b>omits</b> to mention that he was a pole vault champion.</i>
<b>overlook</b>	A high place affording a good view. <i>It s better if the property isn t <b>overlooked</b>.</i>
<b>repent</b>	Feel or express sincere regret or remorse about one s wrongdoing or sin. <i>Marian came to <b>repent</b> her hasty judgement.</i>
<b>rue</b>	A street or road in France. <i>With <b>rue</b> my heart is laden.</i>
<b>unabridged</b>	A dictionary that has not been shortened by the omitting terms or definitions; a comprehensive dictionary. <i>An <b>unabridged</b> novel.</i>
<b>unshared</b>	Not shared. <i>Most of those placed in hostels would prefer <b>unshared</b> independent accommodation.</i>
