
#### Mistreat as a Verb

- Treat badly.
- Treat (a person or animal) badly, cruelly, or unfairly.







### Synonyms of "Mistreat" as a verb (15 Words)

**abuse** Assault (someone, especially a woman or child) sexually.

Her husband often abuses alcohol.

beat Indicate by beating as with the fingers or drumsticks.

We **beat** the competition.

**handle roughly** Touch, lift, or hold with the hands.

hit Score a run or point by hitting a ball with a bat racket stick etc.

He **hit** her hard in the face.

ill-treat Treat badly.ill-use Treat badly.

**knock about** Sound like a car engine that is firing too early.

**knock around** Deliver a sharp blow or push.

maltreat Treat badly.

Children die from neglect or are **maltreat**ed by their carers.

mishandle Manage or deal with (something) wrongly or ineffectively.

The officer had **mishandle**d the situation.

Treat (someone or something) badly or unfairly.

**misuse** The director of the factory **misuse**d the funds intended for the health

care of his workers.

Place a ship s mast in its step.

He won t **step** into his father s foot**step**s.


Strike Undertake strike action against an employer.

**Strike** a balance.

**treat badly** Provide with a gift or entertainment.

**treat roughly** Act on verbally or in some form of artistic expression.

afflict Cause physical pain or suffering in.

barbarous Extremely brutal.

A barbarous crime.

cruelly With cruelty.

Their hopes were **cruelly** dashed.

discriminate Distinguish.

**Discriminate** people.

Of or relating to Draco or his harsh code of laws.

**draconian** The Nazis destroyed the independence of the press by a series of **draconian** 

laws.



**expletive** An oath or swear word.

**Expletive**s were deleted.

exterminate Kill en masse; kill on a large scale; kill many.

They use poison to **exterminate** moles.

**ferocious** Marked by extreme and violent energy. A **ferocious** headache.

Make repeated small-scale attacks on (an enemy.

This man **harass**es his female co workers.

heinous (of a person or wrongful act, especially a crime) utterly odious or wicked.

**Heinous** accusations.

irritate Make (someone) annoyed or a little angry.

Aspirin **irritate**s my stomach.

maltreat Treat badly.

Children die from neglect or are **maltreat**ed by their carers.

merciless Showing no mercy.

The **merciless** summer heat.

change the inherent purpose or function of something.

A **misuse** of power.

mock
The act of mocking or ridiculing.

At Christmas arguments and friction **mock** our pretence at peace.

Keep (someone) in subjection and hardship, especially by the unjust exercise

**oppress** of authority.

He was **oppress**ed by some secret worry.

**parricide** A person who commits parricide.

persecute Cause to suffer.

No one should be **persecute**d for their religious beliefs.

**persecutor** A person who harasses or annoys someone persistently.

He is badly scarred by his treatment at the hands of his **persecutor**s.

relentlessly In an unceasingly intense or harsh way.

He was being bullied **relentlessly** at school.

ruthless Having or showing no pity or compassion for others.

A **ruthless** manipulator.

ruthlessly In a ruthless manner.

They fell prey to money lenders who **ruthlessly** exploited them.

sadistic Deriving pleasure or sexual gratification from inflicting pain on another.

A **sadistic** killer.



sanguinary

Marked by eagerness to resort to violence and bloodshed-G.W.Johnson.

They lost be guilt in the care with any lost he defilled.

They lost heavily in the **sanguinary** campaigns that followed.

torment Torment emotionally or mentally.

Their deaths have left both families in **torment**.

Subject to torture.

torture

He was tortured by grief.

**truculence** Obstreperous and defiant aggressiveness.

truculent Eager or quick to argue or fight; aggressively defiant.

The **truculent** attitude of farmers to cheaper imports.
