- *A way of operating or using a system.*
- *How something is done or how it happens.*
- *A classification of propositions on the basis of whether they claim necessity or possibility or impossibility.*
- *The value that occurs most frequently in a given set of data.*
- *The most frequent value of a random variable.*

- A fashion or style in clothes, art, literature, etc.
- Any of various fixed orders of the various diatonic notes within an octave.
- A way or manner in which something occurs or is experienced, expressed, or done.
- Any of the distinct kinds or patterns of vibration of an oscillating system.
- Verb inflections that express how the action or state is conceived by the speaker.

<u>methodology</u>	A system of methods used in a particular area of study or activity. <i>A methodology for investigating the concept of focal points.</i>
midpoint	A point somewhere in the middle. <i>He would have been at the midpoint in his career.</i>
modal value	An ideal accepted by some individual or group.
<u>modality</u>	A particular mode in which something exists or is experienced or expressed. <i>The harmony had a touch of modality.</i>
modus operandi	An unvarying or habitual method or procedure.
mood	A characteristic (habitual or relatively temporary) state of feeling. <i>He was obviously in a mood.</i>
musical mode	A play or film whose action and dialogue is interspersed with singing and dancing.

operation	Psychology the performance of some composite cognitive activity an operation that affects mental contents. <i>Certain machine tool operations.</i>
position	An opinion that is held in opposition to another in an argument or dispute. <i>He made up ground to finish in second position.</i>
practice	Knowledge of how something is usually done. <i>The practice of the law.</i>
procedure	A mode of conducting legal and parliamentary proceedings. <i>The procedure of obtaining a driver s license.</i>
