Synonyms of "Moderately" as an adverb (17 Words)

adequately	To a satisfactory or acceptable extent. <i>The resources required to prepare adequately will be extensive.</i>
comparatively	In a relative manner; by comparison to something else. <i>Inflation was comparatively low.</i>
fairly	Without favoring one party, in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>I was fairly certain she had nothing to do with the affair.</i>
jolly	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>Jolly decent of him.</i>
middling	Fairly or moderately. <i>Middling rich.</i>
passably	To certain extent or degree. <i>He was passably attractive.</i>
pretty	To a moderately high degree; fairly. <i>Pretty big.</i>

<u>quite</u>	To the utmost or most absolute extent or degree; absolutely; completely. <i>You've no intention of coming back I'm quite sorry but no I have not.</i>
<u>rather</u>	On the contrary. <i>Prospective buyers should meet the seller in person rather.</i>
reasonably	By sensible standards of judgement; justifiably. <i>Acted quite reasonably.</i>
<u>relatively</u>	Regarded in comparison with something else rather than absolutely; quite. <i>The site was cheap and relatively clean.</i>
satisfactorily	In a satisfactory manner. <i>The matter is considered to be satisfactorily resolved.</i>
<u>somewhat</u>	To a moderate extent or by a moderate amount; rather. <i>His arguments were somewhat self-contradictory.</i>
to some extent	Imprecise but fairly close to correct.
tolerably	In an acceptable (but not outstanding) manner. <i>She plays tennis tolerably.</i>
within limits	On the inside.
within reason	On the inside.



Usage Examples of "Moderately" as an adverb

- *Both hotels are moderately priced.*
- *Growth continues moderately.*
- *The event was moderately successful.*

<u>girlfriend</u>	A person's regular female companion with whom they have a romantic or sexual relationship. <i>Mary and her girlfriend organized the party.</i>
handsome	(of a man) good-looking. <i>Very pretty but not so extraordinarily handsome.</i>
impartial	Treating all rivals or disputants equally. <i>The impartial eye of a scientist.</i>
interim	An interim dividend profit etc. <i>An interim agreement.</i>
intermediate	A person at an intermediate level of knowledge or skill. <i>An intermediate course.</i>
<u>middle</u>	Put in the middle. <i>The early and middle part of life.</i>
<u>modest</u>	Marked by simplicity; having a humble opinion of yourself. <i>A modest apartment.</i>
much	To a very great degree or extent. <i>We enjoyed ourselves very much.</i>
overdo	Do, use, or carry to excess; exaggerate. <i>I d simply overdone it in the gym.</i>
<u>partially</u>	Only in part; to a limited extent. <i>He was partially paralyzed.</i>
partly	To some extent; in some degree; not wholly. <i>The result is partly a matter of skill and partly of chance.</i>
<u>possibly</u>	Used to emphasize that one feels that something is surprising, or bewildering. <i>Be as noisy as you possibly can.</i>
preferably	Ideally; if possible. <i>Clean it well preferably with warm water.</i>
<u>pretty</u>	Make pretty or attractive. <i>A pretty little girl with an engaging grin.</i>
<u>quite</u>	To the greatest extent; completely. <i>We ve had quite an afternoon.</i>
<u>rather</u>	To some (great or small) extent. <i>This opens up a whole can of worms that should rather be left shut.</i>
<u>ravishing</u>	Stunningly beautiful. <i>A ravishing blonde.</i>

reasonably	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>Acted quite reasonably.</i>
<u>resemble</u>	Appear like; be similar or bear a likeness to. <i>Some people resemble their dogs.</i>
significantly	In a manner that suggests a meaning or message that is not explicitly stated. <i>He paused significantly.</i>
<u>slightly</u>	To a small degree; not considerably. <i>Slightly built.</i>
<u>some</u>	To some extent quite a lot. <i>He was still some distance away.</i>
<u>somewhat</u>	To certain extent or degree. <i>Matters have improved somewhat since then.</i>
substantially	For the most part; essentially. <i>Substantially higher pension costs.</i>
<u>unimpressive</u>	Not capable of impressing. <i>Her early academic record was unimpressive.</i>
