- *To a moderately sufficient extent or degree.*
- *To certain extent or degree.*
- *Within reasonable limits.*



## Synonyms of "Moderately" as an adverb (17 Words)

<b>adequately</b>	To a satisfactory or acceptable extent. <i>The resources required to prepare <b>adequately</b> will be extensive.</i>
<b>comparatively</b>	In a relative manner; by comparison to something else. <i>Inflation was <b>comparatively</b> low.</i>
<b>fairly</b>	Without favoring one party, in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>I was <b>fairly</b> certain she had nothing to do with the affair.</i>
<b>jolly</b>	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i><b>Jolly</b> decent of him.</i>
<b>middling</b>	Fairly or moderately. <i><b>Middling</b> rich.</i>
<b>passably</b>	To certain extent or degree. <i>He was <b>passably</b> attractive.</i>
<b>pretty</b>	To a moderately high degree; fairly. <i><b>Pretty</b> big.</i>

<b>quite</b>	To the utmost or most absolute extent or degree; absolutely; completely. <i>You've no intention of coming back I'm <b>quite</b> sorry but no I have not.</i>
<b>rather</b>	On the contrary. <i>Prospective buyers should meet the seller in person <b>rather</b>.</i>
<b>reasonably</b>	By sensible standards of judgement; justifiably. <i>Acted quite <b>reasonably</b>.</i>
<b>relatively</b>	Regarded in comparison with something else rather than absolutely; quite. <i>The site was cheap and <b>relatively</b> clean.</i>
<b>satisfactorily</b>	In a satisfactory manner. <i>The matter is considered to be <b>satisfactorily</b> resolved.</i>
<b>somewhat</b>	To a moderate extent or by a moderate amount; rather. <i>His arguments were <b>somewhat</b> self-contradictory.</i>
<b>to some extent</b>	Imprecise but fairly close to correct.
<b>tolerably</b>	In an acceptable (but not outstanding) manner. <i>She plays tennis <b>tolerably</b>.</i>
<b>within limits</b>	On the inside.
<b>within reason</b>	On the inside.





### **Usage Examples of "Moderately" as an adverb**

- *Both hotels are moderately priced.*
- *Growth continues moderately.*
- *The event was moderately successful.*

- camouflage** Hide or disguise the presence of a person animal or object by means of camouflage.

- comparatively** In a relative manner; by comparison to something else.  
*Inflation was **comparatively** low.*
- enough** An adequate quantity a quantity that is large enough to achieve a purpose.  
*At the time he wasn't old **enough** to vote.*
- fairly** To certain extent or degree.  
*Deal **fairly** with one another.*

<b><u>girlfriend</u></b>	A person's regular female companion with whom they have a romantic or sexual relationship. <i>Mary and her <b>girlfriend</b> organized the party.</i>
<b>handsome</b>	(of a man) good-looking. <i>Very pretty but not so extraordinarily <b>handsome</b>.</i>
<b>impartial</b>	Treating all rivals or disputants equally. <i>The <b>impartial</b> eye of a scientist.</i>
<b>interim</b>	An interim dividend profit etc. <i>An <b>interim</b> agreement.</i>
<b>intermediate</b>	A person at an intermediate level of knowledge or skill. <i>An <b>intermediate</b> course.</i>
<b><u>middle</u></b>	Put in the middle. <i>The early and <b>middle</b> part of life.</i>
<b><u>modest</u></b>	Marked by simplicity; having a humble opinion of yourself. <i>A <b>modest</b> apartment.</i>
<b>much</b>	To a very great degree or extent. <i>We enjoyed ourselves very <b>much</b>.</i>
<b>overdo</b>	Do, use, or carry to excess; exaggerate. <i>I d simply <b>overdone</b> it in the gym.</i>
<b><u>partially</u></b>	Only in part; to a limited extent. <i>He was <b>partially</b> paralyzed.</i>
<b>partly</b>	To some extent; in some degree; not wholly. <i>The result is <b>partly</b> a matter of skill and <b>partly</b> of chance.</i>
<b><u>possibly</u></b>	Used to emphasize that one feels that something is surprising, or bewildering. <i>Be as noisy as you <b>possibly</b> can.</i>
<b>preferably</b>	Ideally; if possible. <i>Clean it well <b>preferably</b> with warm water.</i>
<b><u>pretty</u></b>	Make pretty or attractive. <i>A <b>pretty</b> little girl with an engaging grin.</i>
<b><u>quite</u></b>	To the greatest extent; completely. <i>We ve had <b>quite</b> an afternoon.</i>
<b><u>rather</u></b>	To some (great or small) extent. <i>This opens up a whole can of worms that should <b>rather</b> be left shut.</i>
<b><u>ravishing</u></b>	Stunningly beautiful. <i>A <b>ravishing</b> blonde.</i>

<b>reasonably</b>	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>Acted quite <b>reasonably</b>.</i>
<b><u>resemble</u></b>	Appear like; be similar or bear a likeness to. <i>Some people <b>resemble</b> their dogs.</i>
<b>significantly</b>	In a manner that suggests a meaning or message that is not explicitly stated. <i>He paused <b>significantly</b>.</i>
<b><u>slightly</u></b>	To a small degree; not considerably. <i><b>Slightly</b> built.</i>
<b><u>some</u></b>	To some extent quite a lot. <i>He was still <b>some</b> distance away.</i>
<b><u>somewhat</u></b>	To certain extent or degree. <i>Matters have improved <b>somewhat</b> since then.</i>
<b>substantially</b>	For the most part; essentially. <i><b>Substantially</b> higher pension costs.</i>
<b><u>unimpressive</u></b>	Not capable of impressing. <i>Her early academic record was <b>unimpressive</b>.</i>
