Synonyms of "Moderately" as an adverb (17 Words)

adequately

To a satisfactory or acceptable extent.

The resources required to prepare **adequately** will be extensive.

comparatively In a relative manner; by comparison to something else.

Inflation was **comparatively** *low.*

fairlyWithout favoring one party, in a fair evenhanded manner.

I was **fairly** certain she had nothing to do with the affair.

To a moderately sufficient extent or degree.

Jolly decent of him.

middling Fairly or moderately.

Middling rich.

passably To certain extent or degree.

He was **passably** attractive.

To a moderately high degree; fairly.

Pretty big.



To the utmost or most absolute extent or degree; absolutely; completely.

You ve no intention of coming back I m quite sorry but no I have not.

On the contrary.

rather

Prospective buyers should meet the seller in person rather.

reasonably

By sensible standards of judgement; justifiably.

Acted quite **reasonably**.

relativelyRegarded in comparison with something else rather than absolutely; quite.

The site was cheap and **relatively** clean.

satisfactorily In a satisfactory manner.

The matter is considered to be **satisfactorily** resolved.

To a moderate extent or by a moderate amount; rather.

His arguments were **somewhat** self contradictory.

to some extent Imprecise but fairly close to correct.

tolerably

In an acceptable (but not outstanding) manner.

She plays tennis **tolerably**.

within limits On the inside.within reason On the inside.

Be as noisy as you **possibly** can.

preferably Ideally; if possible.

Clean it well **preferably** with warm water.

Make pretty or attractive.

To the greatest extent; completely.

To some (great or small) extent.

To a small degree; not considerably.

slightly Slightly built.

To some extent quite a lot.

substantially For the most part; essentially.

unimpressive Not capable of impressing.
