## Associations of "Monopoly" (30 Words)

<b>asset</b>	A useful or valuable thing or person. <i>Growth in net <b>assets</b>.</i>
<b>authoritarian</b>	An authoritarian person. <i>The transition from an <b>authoritarian</b> to a democratic regime.</i>
<b>authority</b>	Persons who exercise (administrative) control over others. <i>Military forces have the legal <b>authority</b> to arrest drug traffickers.</i>
<b>business</b>	Business concerns collectively. <i>The tea <b>business</b>.</i>
<b>control</b>	The economic policy of controlling or limiting or curbing prices or wages etc. <i>He had to <b>control</b> his temper.</i>
<b>divestiture</b>	An order to an offending party to rid itself of property; it has the purpose of depriving the defendant of the gains of wrongful behavior. <i>The <b>divestiture</b> of state owned assets.</i>
<b>enterprise</b>	Initiative and resourcefulness. <i>A growing <b>enterprise</b> must have a bold leader.</i>
<b>exception</b>	An instance that does not conform to a rule or generalization. <i>All her children were brilliant the only <b>exception</b> was her last child.</i>
<b><a href="#">exclusive</a></b>	(of terms) excluding all but what is specified. <i>They have <b>exclusive</b> use of the machine.</i>
<b>jurisdiction</b>	The right and power to interpret and apply the law. <i>Courts having <b>jurisdiction</b> in this district.</i>
<b>manage</b>	Be the manager of a sports team or a performer. <i>She <b>managed</b> her parents affairs after they got too old.</i>
<b>management</b>	The process of dealing with or controlling things or people. <i>Long term <b>management</b> of patients with cirrhosis.</i>

<b>microprocessor</b>	Integrated circuit semiconductor chip that performs the bulk of the processing and controls the parts of a system. <i>A disk drive contains a <b>microprocessor</b> to handle the internal functions of the drive.</i>
<b>oligopoly</b>	A market in which control over the supply of a commodity is in the hands of a small number of producers and each one can influence prices and affect competitors.
<b>only</b>	Being the only one single and isolated from others. <i>An <b>only</b> child.</i>
<b>plan</b>	Make plans for something. <i>They drew up a six step <b>plan</b>.</i>
<b>privatization</b>	The transfer of a business, industry, or service from public to private ownership and control. <i>The government launched a new round of <b>privatizations</b>.</i>
<b>purvey</b>	Supply with provisions. <i>Shops <b>purveying</b> cooked food.</i>
<b>purview</b>	The scope of the influence or concerns of something. <i>Social taboos meant that little information was likely to come within the <b>purview</b> of women generally.</i>
<b>realtor</b>	A person who acts as an agent for the sale and purchase of buildings and land; an estate agent.
<b>restricted</b>	Restricted in meaning as e.g. man in a tall man. <i>Some enzymes cleave DNA at <b>restricted</b> sites.</i>
<b>sale</b>	An agreement (or contract) in which property is transferred from the seller (vendor) to the buyer (vendee) for a fixed price in money (paid or agreed to be paid by the buyer). <i>You'll find vitamin C for <b>sale</b> at most pharmacies.</i>
<b>selective</b>	Characterized by very careful or fastidious selection. <i>The cow is the result of generations of <b>selective</b> breeding.</i>
<b>sell</b>	Sell all of one's property possessions or assets. <i>The prime minister has come under fire for <b>selling</b> out to the United States.</i>
<b>sole</b>	Put a new sole on to a shoe. <i><b>Sole</b> rights of publication.</i>
<b>stability</b>	The quality or attribute of being firm and steadfast. <i>There are fears for the political <b>stability</b> of the area.</i>

<b>steer</b>	The type of steering of a vehicle. <i>The teacher <b>steered</b> the gifted students towards the more challenging courses.</i>
<b>strategical</b>	Relating to or concerned with strategy.
<b>uniquely</b>	In a very special or unusual way. <i><b>Uniquely</b> the United Kingdom is on target to fulfil the promise to double its aid to developing nations.</i>
<b>unshared</b>	Not shared. <i>Most of those placed in hostels would prefer <b>unshared</b> independent accommodation.</i>
