manage	Be the manager of a sports team or a performer. She manage d her parents affairs after they got too old.
management	The process of dealing with or controlling things or people. Long term management of patients with cirrhosis.



microprocessor	Integrated circuit semiconductor chip that performs the bulk of the processing and controls the parts of a system. A disk drive contains a microprocessor to handle the internal functions of the drive.
oligopoly	A market in which control over the supply of a commodity is in the hands of a small number of producers and each one can influence prices and affect competitors.
<u>only</u>	Being the only one single and isolated from others. An only child.
plan	Make plans for something. They drew up a six step plan .
privatization	The transfer of a business, industry, or service from public to private ownership and control. The government launched a new round of privatization s.
purvey	Supply with provisions. Shops purvey ing cooked food.
<u>purview</u>	The scope of the influence or concerns of something. Social taboos meant that little information was likely to come within the purview of women generally.
realtor	A person who acts as an agent for the sale and purchase of buildings and land; an estate agent.
<u>restricted</u>	Restricted in meaning as e g man in a tall man. Some enzymes cleave DNA at restricted sites.
sale	An agreement (or contract) in which property is transferred from the seller (vendor) to the buyer (vendee) for a fixed price in money (paid or agreed to be paid by the buyer. You ll find vitamin C for sale at most pharmacies.
selective	Characterized by very careful or fastidious selection. The cow is the result of generations of selective breeding.
sell	Sell all of one s property possessions or assets. The prime minister has come under fire for sell ing out to the United States.
<u>sole</u>	Put a new sole on to a shoe. Sole rights of publication.
<u>stability</u>	The quality or attribute of being firm and steadfast. There are fears for the political stability of the area.



<u>steer</u>	The type of steering of a vehicle. The teacher steer ed the gifted students towards the more challenging courses.

uniquely	In a very special or unusual way. Uniquely the United Kingdom is on target to fulfil the promise to double its aid to developing nations.
