asset	A useful or valuable thing or person. <i>Growth in net assets.</i>
authoritarian	An authoritarian person. <i>The transition from an authoritarian to a democratic regime.</i>
authority	Persons who exercise (administrative) control over others. <i>Military forces have the legal authority to arrest drug traffickers.</i>
business	Business concerns collectively. <i>The tea business.</i>
control	The economic policy of controlling or limiting or curbing prices or wages etc. <i>He had to control his temper.</i>
divestiture	An order to an offending party to rid itself of property; it has the purpose of depriving the defendant of the gains of wrongful behavior. <i>The divestiture of state owned assets.</i>
enterprise	Initiative and resourcefulness. <i>A growing enterprise must have a bold leader.</i>
exception	An instance that does not conform to a rule or generalization. <i>All her children were brilliant the only exception was her last child.</i>
exclusive	(of terms) excluding all but what is specified. <i>They have exclusive use of the machine.</i>
jurisdiction	The right and power to interpret and apply the law. <i>Courts having jurisdiction in this district.</i>
manage	Be the manager of a sports team or a performer. <i>She managed her parents affairs after they got too old.</i>
management	The process of dealing with or controlling things or people. <i>Long term management of patients with cirrhosis.</i>

microprocessor	Integrated circuit semiconductor chip that performs the bulk of the processing and controls the parts of a system. <i>A disk drive contains a microprocessor to handle the internal functions of the drive.</i>
oligopoly	A market in which control over the supply of a commodity is in the hands of a small number of producers and each one can influence prices and affect competitors.
only	Being the only one single and isolated from others. <i>An only child.</i>
plan	Make plans for something. <i>They drew up a six step plan.</i>
privatization	The transfer of a business, industry, or service from public to private ownership and control. <i>The government launched a new round of privatizations.</i>
purvey	Supply with provisions. <i>Shops purveying cooked food.</i>
purview	The scope of the influence or concerns of something. <i>Social taboos meant that little information was likely to come within the purview of women generally.</i>
realtor	A person who acts as an agent for the sale and purchase of buildings and land; an estate agent.
restricted	Restricted in meaning as e.g. man in a tall man. <i>Some enzymes cleave DNA at restricted sites.</i>
sale	An agreement (or contract) in which property is transferred from the seller (vendor) to the buyer (vendee) for a fixed price in money (paid or agreed to be paid by the buyer). <i>You'll find vitamin C for sale at most pharmacies.</i>
selective	Characterized by very careful or fastidious selection. <i>The cow is the result of generations of selective breeding.</i>
sell	Sell all of one's property possessions or assets. <i>The prime minister has come under fire for selling out to the United States.</i>
sole	Put a new sole on to a shoe. <i>Sole rights of publication.</i>
stability	The quality or attribute of being firm and steadfast. <i>There are fears for the political stability of the area.</i>

steer	The type of steering of a vehicle. <i>The teacher steered the gifted students towards the more challenging courses.</i>
strategical	Relating to or concerned with strategy.
uniquely	In a very special or unusual way. <i>Uniquely the United Kingdom is on target to fulfil the promise to double its aid to developing nations.</i>
unshared	Not shared. <i>Most of those placed in hostels would prefer unshared independent accommodation.</i>
