### Definitions of "Monstrosity" as a noun

- *A person or animal that is markedly unusual or deformed.*
- *A thing, especially a building, which is very large and unsightly.*
- *A grossly malformed animal or plant.*
- *A thing which is outrageously evil or wrong.*
- *Something hideous or frightful.*



## Synonyms of "Monstrosity" as a noun (14 Words)

<b>abortion</b>	The arrest of the development of a seed, fruit, or other organ. <i>Concerns such as <b>abortion</b> and euthanasia.</i>
<b>blot on the landscape</b>	An act that brings discredit to the person who does it.
<b>carbuncle</b>	A severe abscess or multiple boil in the skin, typically infected with staphylococcus bacteria.
<b>excrescence</b>	(pathology) an abnormal outgrowth or enlargement of some part of the body. <i>The bony <b>excrescence</b> between its horns.</i>
<b>eyesore</b>	Something very ugly and offensive. <i>The office crumbled into an <b>eyesore</b>.</i>
<b>freak</b>	A person addicted to a particular drug. <i>A <b>freak</b> red cabbage with side shoots coming from the leaves.</i>
<b>freak of nature</b>	A person or animal that is markedly unusual or deformed.
<b>grotesque sight</b>	Art characterized by an incongruous mixture of parts of humans and animals interwoven with plants.
<b>horror</b>	A literary or film genre concerned with arousing feelings of horror. <i><b>Horrors</b> two buttons were missing.</i>
<b>lusus naturae</b>	A person or animal that is markedly unusual or deformed.
<b>malformation</b>	Something abnormal or anomalous. <i>The drug may cause <b>malformations</b> in the developing embryo.</i>
<b>monster</b>	A rude or badly behaved person, typically a child. <i>He was an unfeeling treacherous <b>monster</b>.</i>
<b>mutant</b>	A mutant form. <i>Frequently only a small percentage of the offspring of <b>mutants</b> resemble their parents.</i>
<b>mutation</b>	A distinct form resulting from genetic mutation. <i>Whether his goats were a new <b>mutation</b> or part of an older breed remains unclear.</i>

<b>chilling</b>	Horrifying or frightening. <i>A <b>chilling</b> account of the prisoners fate.</i>
<b>colossus</b>	A person or thing of enormous size, importance, or ability. <i>The Russian Empire was the <b>colossus</b> of European politics.</i>
<b>disservice</b>	A harmful action. <i>You have done a <b>disservice</b> to the African people by ignoring this fact.</i>
<b>dread</b>	Dreadlocks. <i>Jane was <b>dreading</b> the party.</i>
<b>dreadful</b>	Exceptionally bad or displeasing. <i>A <b>dreadful</b> storm.</i>
<b>fear</b>	Be afraid of (someone or something) as likely to be dangerous, painful, or harmful. <i>I cowered in <b>fear</b> as bullets whizzed past.</i>
<b>fearsome</b>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>The cat mewed displaying a <b>fearsome</b> set of teeth.</i>
<b>freak</b>	Lose one's nerve. <i>The teacher says the accident was a total <b>freak</b>.</i>
<b>frightening</b>	Making someone afraid or anxious; terrifying. <i>A <b>frightening</b> experience.</i>
<b>frightful</b>	Used for emphasis, especially of something bad. <i>A <b>frightful</b> mistake.</i>
<b>gargantuan</b>	Enormous. <i>A <b>gargantuan</b> appetite.</i>
<b>ghastly</b>	Extremely unwell. <i>She had sobered up but she felt <b>ghastly</b>.</i>
<b>giant</b>	Used in names of very large animals and plants e g giant hogweed giant tortoise. <i><b>Giant</b> multinational corporations.</i>

<b><u>gigantic</u></b>	Of very great size or extent; huge or enormous. <i><b>Gigantic</b> disappointment.</i>
<b>hideous</b>	So extremely ugly as to be terrifying. <i>A <b>hideous</b> pattern of injustice.</i>
<b>horrible</b>	Provoking horror- Winston Churchill. <i>A <b>horrible</b> massacre.</i>
<b><u>horrific</u></b>	Causing horror. <i><b>Horrific</b> conditions in the mining industry.</i>
<b><u>horror</u></b>	Something that inspires horror something horrible. <i>The <b>horrors</b> of civil war.</i>
<b>huge</b>	Of great importance or seriousness. <i>A <b>huge</b> wave.</i>
<b>monster</b>	A large, ugly, and frightening imaginary creature. <i>A <b>monster</b> 36lb carp.</i>
<b>ogre</b>	A cruel wicked and inhuman person. <i>It is clear that I am no <b>ogre</b>.</i>
<b>petrify</b>	Make (someone) so frightened that they are unable to move. <i>Slogans <b>petrify</b> our thinking.</i>
<b>terrible</b>	Extremely bad or serious. <i>The <b>terrible</b> conditions in which the ordinary people lived.</i>
<b><u>terrifying</u></b>	Causing extreme fear. <i>The <b>terrifying</b> events of the past few weeks.</i>
<b><u>troll</u></b>	A fisherman s lure that is used in trolling. <i>He used a spinner as his <b>troll</b>.</i>
<b><u>vibe</u></b>	A person's emotional state or the atmosphere of a place as communicated to and felt by others. <i>We ve been picking up some bad <b>vibes</b> on that guy.</i>
