### **Definitions of "Monuments" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “monuments” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A burial vault (usually for some famous person).*
- *A structure erected to commemorate persons or events.*
- *An important site that is marked and preserved as public property.*



## Synonyms of "Monuments" as a noun (2 Words)

A statement of facts, especially as the basis of a petition.

**memorial** *The Council sent a strongly worded **memorial** to the Chancellor of the Exchequer.*

**repository** A place where something, especially a natural resource, is found in significant quantities.

*The metadata will be aggregated in a **repository**.*



## Associations of "Monuments" (30 Words)

- alabaster** Like alabaster in whiteness and smoothness.  
*Her **alabaster** cheeks flushed with warmth.*
- anniversary** The date on which an event took place or an institution was founded in a previous year.  
*He even forgot our tenth **anniversary**.*
- carve** Cut to pieces.  
*Father **carved** the ham.*
- caryatid** A stone carving of a draped female figure, used as a pillar to support the entablature of a Greek or Greek-style building.
- celebration** A social gathering or enjoyable activity held to celebrate something.  
*The birth of his son was a cause for **celebration**.*
- effigy** A roughly made model of a person that is made in order to be damaged or destroyed as a protest.  
*A tomb **effigy** of Eleanor of Aquitaine.*
- engrave** Be permanently fixed in (one's memory or mind).  
***Engrave** a letter.*
- epigraph** A short quotation or saying at the beginning of a book or chapter, intended to suggest its theme.

<b>etch</b>	Use the etching process to produce a print or design. <i>Ballistic electron emission microscopy is used to <b>etch</b> templates for even smaller circuits.</i>
<b>eulogistic</b>	Formally expressing praise.
<b>gargoyle</b>	A grotesque carved human or animal face or figure projecting from the gutter of a building, typically acting as a spout to carry water clear of a wall.
<b>inscription</b>	The action of inscribing something. <i>The <b>inscription</b> of memorable utterances on durable materials.</i>
<b>marble</b>	A sculpture carved from marble. <i>A couple of girls were playing <b>marbles</b>.</i>
<b>memorial</b>	A structure erected to commemorate persons or events. <i>The Council sent a strongly worded <b>memorial</b> to the Chancellor of the Exchequer.</i>
<b>memorialize</b>	Be or provide a memorial to a person or an event. <i>We <b>memorialized</b> the Dead.</i>
<b>molding</b>	Sculpture produced by molding.
<b>monumental</b>	Of outstanding significance. <i>Einstein s <b>monumental</b> contributions to physics.</i>
<b>plaque</b>	A sticky deposit on teeth in which bacteria proliferate. <i><b>Plaque</b> around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i>
<b>sculpt</b>	Shape (a material like stone or wood) by whittling away at it. <i>She is <b>sculpting</b> the block of marble into an image of her husband.</i>
<b>sculpture</b>	A work of art made by sculpture. <i>A bronze <b>sculpture</b>.</i>
<b>slab</b>	Remove slabs from a log or tree to prepare it for sawing into planks. <i>A <b>slab</b> of bread and cheese.</i>
<b>statuary</b>	Of or relating to or suitable for statues. <i>Classical <b>statuary</b>.</i>
<b>statue</b>	A sculpture representing a human or animal.
<b>statuesque</b>	Suggestive of a statue. <i>Her <b>statuesque</b> beauty.</i>
<b>stone</b>	Kill by throwing stones at. <i>He wanted a special <b>stone</b> to mark the site.</i>
<b>tercentenary</b>	The three-hundredth anniversary of a significant event. <i>His <b>tercentenary</b> year.</i>

**totem** A clan or tribe identified by their kinship to a common totemic object.  
*Other radical groups look to the party as a **totem** of the anti austerity movement.*

**tribute** Denoting or relating to a group or musician that performs the music of a more famous one and typically imitates them in appearance and style of performance.  
*His victory in the championship was a **tribute** to his persistence.*

**triennial** Lasting for or relating to a period of three years.  
*The **triennial** meeting of the Association.*

**woodwork** The activity or skill of making things from wood.  
*He taught **woodwork** at night school.*
