Definitions of "Monuments" as a noun

- *A structure erected to commemorate persons or events.*
- *An important site that is marked and preserved as public property.*



Synonyms of "Monuments" as a noun (2 Words)

A statement of facts, especially as the basis of a petition.

memorial *The Council sent a strongly worded **memorial** to the Chancellor of the Exchequer.*

A place where something, especially a natural resource, is found in significant quantities.

repository *The metadata will be aggregated in a **repository**.*



Associations of "Monuments" (30 Words)

- alabaster** Like alabaster in whiteness and smoothness.
*Her **alabaster** cheeks flushed with warmth.*
- anniversary** The date on which an event took place or an institution was founded in a previous year.
*He even forgot our tenth **anniversary**.*
- carve** Cut to pieces.
*Father **carved** the ham.*
- caryatid** A stone carving of a draped female figure, used as a pillar to support the entablature of a Greek or Greek-style building.
- celebration** A social gathering or enjoyable activity held to celebrate something.
*The birth of his son was a cause for **celebration**.*
- effigy** A roughly made model of a person that is made in order to be damaged or destroyed as a protest.
*A tomb **effigy** of Eleanor of Aquitaine.*
- engrave** Be permanently fixed in (one's memory or mind).
***Engrave** a letter.*
- epigraph** A short quotation or saying at the beginning of a book or chapter, intended to suggest its theme.

etch	Use the etching process to produce a print or design. <i>Ballistic electron emission microscopy is used to etch templates for even smaller circuits.</i>
eulogistic	Formally expressing praise.
gargoyle	A grotesque carved human or animal face or figure projecting from the gutter of a building, typically acting as a spout to carry water clear of a wall.
inscription	The action of inscribing something. <i>The inscription of memorable utterances on durable materials.</i>
marble	A sculpture carved from marble. <i>A couple of girls were playing marbles.</i>
memorial	A structure erected to commemorate persons or events. <i>The Council sent a strongly worded memorial to the Chancellor of the Exchequer.</i>
memorialize	Be or provide a memorial to a person or an event. <i>We memorialized the Dead.</i>
molding	Sculpture produced by molding.
monumental	Of outstanding significance. <i>Einstein's monumental contributions to physics.</i>
plaque	A sticky deposit on teeth in which bacteria proliferate. <i>Plaque around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i>
sculpt	Shape (a material like stone or wood) by whittling away at it. <i>She is sculpting the block of marble into an image of her husband.</i>
sculpture	A work of art made by sculpture. <i>A bronze sculpture.</i>
slab	Remove slabs from a log or tree to prepare it for sawing into planks. <i>A slab of bread and cheese.</i>
statuary	Of or relating to or suitable for statues. <i>Classical statuary.</i>
statue	A sculpture representing a human or animal.
statuesque	Suggestive of a statue. <i>Her statuesque beauty.</i>
stone	Kill by throwing stones at. <i>He wanted a special stone to mark the site.</i>
tercentenary	The three-hundredth anniversary of a significant event. <i>His tercentenary year.</i>

totem A clan or tribe identified by their kinship to a common totemic object.
*Other radical groups look to the party as a **totem** of the anti austerity movement.*

tribute Denoting or relating to a group or musician that performs the music of a more famous one and typically imitates them in appearance and style of performance.
*His victory in the championship was a **tribute** to his persistence.*

triennial Lasting for or relating to a period of three years.
*The **triennial** meeting of the Association.*

woodwork The activity or skill of making things from wood.
*He taught **woodwork** at night school.*
