Synonyms of "Moonlight" as a noun (17 Words)

blaze	Noisy and unrestrained mischief. <i>Their relationship broke up in a blaze of publicity.</i>
brightness	The quality of being cheerful or lively. <i>The brightness will linger through Wednesday.</i>
brilliance	A light within the field of vision that is brighter than the brightness to which the eyes are adapted. <i>His Hamlet lacks the brilliance that one expects.</i>
dazzle	Brightness that blinds someone temporarily. <i>I screwed my eyes up against the dazzle.</i>
glare	Oppressive public attention. <i>A glare of sunlight.</i>
gleam	An appearance of reflected light. <i>She saw a gleam of triumph in his eyes.</i>
gleaming	An appearance of reflected light.

glow	A steady even light without flames. <i>He could feel the brandy filling him with a warm glow.</i>
glowing	The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface.
illumination	A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>Higher levels of illumination are needed for reading.</i>
luminescence	Light from nonthermal sources. <i>Honey fungus produces a ghostly greenish luminescence.</i>
luminosity	The intrinsic brightness of a celestial object (as distinct from its apparent brightness diminished by distance). <i>Acrylic colours retain freshness and luminosity.</i>
lustre	Ceramics with an iridescent metallic glaze lustreware. <i>She couldn't eat and her hair lost its lustre.</i>
moon	Any object resembling a moon. <i>I got my first laser printer many moons ago.</i>
moonshine	Illicitly distilled or smuggled alcohol. <i>Whatever I said it was moonshine.</i>
radiance	Great joy or love, apparent in someone's expression or bearing. <i>Restore your skin's natural radiance.</i>
shining	The work of making something smooth and shiny by rubbing or waxing it. <i>The shining of shoes provided a meager living.</i>

- *The river glittered under the pale moonlight.*
