lustre Ceramics with an iridescent metallic glaze lustreware.

*She couldn t eat and her hair lost its* **lustre**.

**moon** Any object resembling a moon.

moonshine Illicitly distilled or smuggled alcohol.

Whatever I said it was **moonshine**.

radiance Great joy or love, apparent in someone's expression or bearing.

**shining** The work of making something smooth and shiny by rubbing or waxing it.

The **shining** of shoes provided a meager living.
