## Synonyms of "Moonlight" as a noun (17 Words)

<b>blaze</b>	Noisy and unrestrained mischief. <i>Their relationship broke up in a <b>blaze</b> of publicity.</i>
<b>brightness</b>	The quality of being cheerful or lively. <i>The <b>brightness</b> will linger through Wednesday.</i>
<b>brilliance</b>	A light within the field of vision that is brighter than the brightness to which the eyes are adapted. <i>His Hamlet lacks the <b>brilliance</b> that one expects.</i>
<b>dazzle</b>	Brightness that blinds someone temporarily. <i>I screwed my eyes up against the <b>dazzle</b>.</i>
<b>glare</b>	Oppressive public attention. <i>A <b>glare</b> of sunlight.</i>
<b>gleam</b>	An appearance of reflected light. <i>She saw a <b>gleam</b> of triumph in his eyes.</i>
<b>gleaming</b>	An appearance of reflected light.

<b>glow</b>	A steady even light without flames. <i>He could feel the brandy filling him with a warm <b>glow</b>.</i>
<b>glowing</b>	The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface.
<b>illumination</b>	A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>Higher levels of <b>illumination</b> are needed for reading.</i>
<b>luminescence</b>	Light from nonthermal sources. <i>Honey fungus produces a ghostly greenish <b>luminescence</b>.</i>
<b>luminosity</b>	The intrinsic brightness of a celestial object (as distinct from its apparent brightness diminished by distance). <i>Acrylic colours retain freshness and <b>luminosity</b>.</i>
<b>lustre</b>	Ceramics with an iridescent metallic glaze lustreware. <i>She couldn't eat and her hair lost its <b>lustre</b>.</i>
<b>moon</b>	Any object resembling a moon. <i>I got my first laser printer many <b>moons</b> ago.</i>
<b>moonshine</b>	Illicitly distilled or smuggled alcohol. <i>Whatever I said it was <b>moonshine</b>.</i>
<b>radiance</b>	Great joy or love, apparent in someone's expression or bearing. <i>Restore your skin's natural <b>radiance</b>.</i>
<b>shining</b>	The work of making something smooth and shiny by rubbing or waxing it. <i>The <b>shining</b> of shoes provided a meager living.</i>
