### Definitions of "Morbid" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “morbid” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Characterized by an abnormal and unhealthy interest in disturbing and unpleasant subjects, especially death and disease.*
- *Suggesting the horror of death and decay.*
- *Suggesting an unhealthy mental state.*
- *Of the nature of or indicative of disease.*
- *Caused by or altered by or manifesting disease or pathology.*

<b><u>diseased</u></b>	Caused by or altered by or manifesting disease or pathology. <i><b>Diseased</b> trees.</i>
<b><u>ghastly</u></b>	Very objectionable, bad, or unpleasant. <i>One of the most <b>ghastly</b> crimes ever committed.</i>
<b>ghoulish</b>	Morbidly interested in death or disaster. <i>She told the story with <b>ghoulish</b> relish.</i>
<b>grisly</b>	Causing horror or disgust. <i>A <b>grisly</b> murder.</i>
<b><u>grotesque</u></b>	Distorted and unnatural in shape or size; abnormal and hideous. <i>A lifestyle of <b>grotesque</b> luxury.</i>
<b><u>gruesome</u></b>	Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. <i><b>Gruesome</b> catering.</i>
<b>horrible</b>	Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking. <i>War is beyond all words <b>horrible</b>.</i>



<b><u>macabre</u></b>	Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. <i>A <b>macabre</b> series of murders.</i>
<b>pathologic</b>	Caused by or altered by or manifesting disease or pathology. <i><b>Pathologic</b> tissue.</i>
<b>pathological</b>	Relating to pathology. <i>A <b>pathological</b> liar.</i>
<b><u>unhealthy</u></b>	Not having or showing good health. <i><b>Unhealthy</b> ulcers.</i>
<b>unwholesome</b>	Detrimental to physical or moral well-being. <i><b>Unwholesome</b> food.</i>

## Associations of "Morbid" (30 Words)

<b>absorption</b>	A process in which one substance permeates another; a fluid permeates or is dissolved by a liquid or solid. <i>Her <b>absorption</b> in the problems of the Third World.</i>
<b>assimilation</b>	The social process of absorbing one cultural group into harmony with another. <i>Nitrate <b>assimilation</b> usually takes place in leaves.</i>
<b>asthmatic</b>	A person who suffers from asthma. <i>The painful gasps of a dying <b>asthmatic</b>.</i>
<b>complexion</b>	The coloring of a person's face. <i>The <b>complexion</b> of the game changed.</i>

<u>concentration</u>	Strengthening the concentration as of a solute in a mixture by removing diluting material. <i>The island has the greatest <b>concentration</b> of seabirds in the north west.</i>
dotage	Mental infirmity as a consequence of old age; sometimes shown by foolish infatuations. <i>You could live here and look after me in my <b>dotage</b>.</i>
<u>fetish</u>	An inanimate object worshipped for its supposed magical powers or because it is considered to be inhabited by a spirit. <i>A foot <b>fetish</b>.</i>
<u>fixation</u>	An obsessive interest in or feeling about someone or something. <i>During the period of total blindness there was a complete absence of visual <b>fixation</b>.</i>
<u>immersion</u>	The act of wetting something by submerging it. <i>His back was still raw from <b>immersion</b> in the icy Atlantic sea.</i>
indisposed	(usually followed by 'to') strongly opposed. <i>Feeling a bit <b>indisposed</b> today.</i>
infatuation	A foolish and usually extravagant passion or love or admiration. <i>He had developed an <b>infatuation</b> with the girl.</i>
infirmity	Physical or mental weakness. <i>Old age and <b>infirmity</b> come to men and women alike.</i>
malnourished	Suffering from malnutrition.
nauseous	Affected with nausea; feeling inclined to vomit. <i><b>Nauseous</b> offal.</i>
<u>neurotic</u>	A neurotic person. <i>He seemed a <b>neurotic</b> self obsessed character.</i>
<u>obsession</u>	The state of being obsessed with someone or something. <i>He was in the grip of an <b>obsession</b> he was powerless to resist.</i>
<u>obsessive</u>	Affected by an obsession. <i>He s an <b>obsessive</b> obsessed with having complete collections of things.</i>
pathological	Involving or caused by a physical or mental disease. <i>A <b>pathological</b> urge to succeed.</i>
poisonous	Not safe to eat. <i><b>Poisonous</b> chemicals.</i>
<u>preoccupation</u>	A subject or matter that engrosses someone. <i>Their main <b>preoccupation</b> was how to feed their families.</i>
sallow	Cause to become sallow. <i><b>Sallow</b> faced addicts.</i>



<b>sick</b>	People who are sick. <i><b>Sick</b> to death of flattery.</i>
<b>sickness</b>	The feeling or fact of being affected with nausea or vomiting. <i>A great <b>sickness</b> of his judgment.</i>
<b>starving</b>	The act of depriving of food or subjecting to famine. <i>The world s <b>starving</b> children.</i>
<b>surround</b>	Surround with a wall in order to fortify. <i>Troops <b>surrounded</b> the parliament building.</i>
<b>twisted</b>	Forced out of its natural or proper shape; crumpled. <i>Suffering a <b>twisted</b> ankle he was carried from the field.</i>
<b>underweight</b>	Having less investment in a particular area than is normal or desirable. <i><b>Underweighted</b> assets.</i>
<b>unhealthy</b>	(of a person's attitude or behaviour) not sensible or well balanced. <i><b>Unhealthy</b> ulcers.</i>
<b>unwholesome</b>	Detrimental to physical or moral well-being. <i><b>Unwholesome</b> food.</i>
<b>worm</b>	The threaded cylinder in a worm gear. <i>I <b>wormed</b> my way along the roadside ditch.</i>
