Synonyms of "Morning" as a noun (15 Words)

aurora	A natural electrical phenomenon characterized by the appearance of streamers of reddish or greenish light in the sky especially near the northern or southern magnetic pole The effect is caused by the interaction of charged particles from the sun with atoms in the upper atmosphere In northern and southern regions it is respectively called aurora borealis or Northern Lights and aurora australis or Southern Lights.
break of day	The act of breaking something.
break of the day	Breaking of hard tissue such as bone.
cockcrow	Dawn. <i>She helped him to dance until cockcrow.</i>
dawn	An opening time period. <i>It was the dawn of the Roman Empire.</i>

dawning	The first light of day. <i>The dawnings of civilization.</i>
daybreak	The time in the morning when daylight first appears; dawn. <i>She set off at daybreak.</i>
dayspring	The first light of day.
first light	The first or highest in an ordering or series.
forenoon	The morning. <i>The forenoon watch.</i>
good morning	Moral excellence or admirableness.
morn	The time period between dawn and noon. <i>I spent the morning running errands.</i>
morning time	The first light of day.
<u>sunrise</u>	The colours and light visible in the sky on an occasion of the sun's first appearance in the morning, considered as a view or spectacle. <i>An hour before sunrise.</i>
sunup	The time in the morning when the sun appears or full daylight arrives. <i>They worked from sunup to sundown.</i>

february	The month following January and preceding March.
friday	The sixth day of the week; the fifth working day.
hour	A time of day specified as an exact number of hours from midnight or midday. <i>The job will take more than an hour.</i>
january	The first month of the year; begins 10 days after the winter solstice.
lunchtime	The time in the middle of the day when lunch is eaten. <i>The lunchtime television news.</i>
midday	The middle of the day; noon. <i>He awoke at midday.</i>
midnight	Twelve o'clock at night. <i>The midnight hours.</i>
monday	The second day of the week; the first working day.
noon	Twelve o'clock in the day; midday. <i>The service starts at twelve noon.</i>
o'clock	According to the clock.
saturday	The seventh and last day of the week; observed as the Sabbath by Jews and some Christians.
sunday	United States evangelist (1862-1935).
sunny	(of a place) receiving much sunlight. <i>Seefeld is set high on a sunny plateau.</i>
sunrise	Atmospheric phenomena accompanying the daily appearance of the sun. <i>High technology sunrise industries.</i>
thursday	The fifth day of the week; the fourth working day.
tonight	During the night of the present day. <i>Drop by tonight.</i>
tuesday	The third day of the week; the second working day.
wake	Be awake be alert be there. <i>His workers absented themselves for the local wakes.</i>
wednesday	The fourth day of the week; the third working day.
week	The time spent working during a week. <i>She works a 48 hour week.</i>
weekday	A day of the week other than Sunday or Saturday. <i>The weekday rush hour.</i>

weekend Spend a weekend somewhere.
A **weekend** break.

year A period of time occupying a regular part of a calendar year that is used for some particular activity.
A school **year**.
