anatomical	Of or relating to the branch of morphology that studies the structure of organisms. <i>Anatomical abnormalities.</i>
computer	A machine for performing calculations automatically.
conceptual	Being or characterized by concepts or their formation. <i>Conceptual discussions.</i>
congruence	Agreement or harmony; compatibility. <i>The results show quite good congruence with recent studies.</i>
construction	The act of constructing something. <i>She wore her hair in an amazing construction of whirls and ribbons.</i>
constructive	Having or intended to have a useful or beneficial purpose. <i>A constructive attitude.</i>
dissection	Very detailed analysis of a text or idea. <i>This dissection of modern relationships.</i>
equilateral	Having all sides or faces equal. <i>An equilateral triangle.</i>
establishment	An organization founded and united for a specific purpose. <i>Hotels or catering establishments.</i>
ferroconcrete	Concrete with metal and/or mesh added to provide extra support against stresses. <i>A ferroconcrete storage tank.</i>
form	Details of previous performances by a racehorse or greyhound. <i>He first sketches the plot in outline form.</i>
frame	Enclose in a frame as of a picture. <i>We have in our inward frame various affections.</i>
framework	A structure supporting or containing something. <i>A conservatory in a delicate framework of iron.</i>

functional	Performing or capable of performing. <i>A functional role.</i>
functionalist	An adherent of functionalism.
<u>invent</u>	Make up (an idea, name, story, etc.), especially so as to deceive someone. <i>He invented an improved form of the steam engine.</i>
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>The lift stopped and he peered through the metal lattice.</i>
lineament	A characteristic property that defines the apparent individual nature of something. <i>I recognized those haggard lineaments.</i>
morphological	Relating to the form or structure of things. <i>Morphological differences.</i>
<u>morphology</u>	The branch of biology that deals with the form of living organisms, and with relationships between their structures. <i>Grammar is organized along two main dimensions morphology and syntax.</i>
polymorphous	Having or occurring in several distinct forms. <i>Polymorphous crystallization.</i>
remodel	Cast or model anew. <i>She remodelled the head with careful fingers.</i>
rigidity	Inability to be changed or adapted. <i>The tough substance that gives plants their rigidity.</i>
<u>sculpture</u>	A work of art made by sculpture. <i>A bronze sculpture.</i>
simulation	The production of a computer model of something, especially for the purpose of study. <i>Simulation models will allow researchers to test different strategies.</i>
<u>skeleton</u>	A sport in which a competitor races down a frozen track on a skeleton sled. <i>There was only a skeleton staff on duty.</i>
structural	Relating to or concerned with the morphology of plants and animals. <i>There have been structural changes in the industry.</i>
structuralism	An anthropological theory that there are unobservable social structures that generate observable social phenomena.
structure	Give a structure to. <i>The structure of the benzene molecule.</i>
