### **Definitions of "Morphology" as a noun**

- *The branch of biology that deals with the structure of animals and plants.*
- *A particular form, shape, or structure.*
- *The study of the forms of words, in particular inflected forms.*
- *The branch of geology that studies the characteristics and configuration and evolution of rocks and land forms.*
- *The branch of biology that deals with the form of living organisms, and with relationships between their structures.*
- *The study of the forms of things.*
- *The admissible arrangement of sounds in words.*
- *Studies of the rules for forming admissible words.*

<b>alphabet</b>	The basic elements in a system which combine to form complex entities. <i>The first letter of the <b>alphabet</b>.</i>
<b>analyze</b>	Consider in detail and subject to an analysis in order to discover essential features or meaning. <i><b>Analyze</b> today's financial market.</i>
<b>anatomical</b>	Of or relating to the branch of morphology that studies the structure of organisms. <i><b>Anatomical</b> abnormalities.</i>
<a href="#"><u>anatomy</u></a>	The bodily structure of an organism. <i>He studied the <b>anatomy</b> of crimes.</i>
<b>collocation</b>	The action of placing things side by side or in position. <i>Strong tea and heavy drinker are typical English <b>collocations</b>.</i>
<b>dissection</b>	A minute and critical analysis. <i>The <b>dissection</b> of animals for scientific research.</i>
<b>form</b>	Bring or be brought into a certain formation. <i>The team was off <b>form</b> last night.</i>
<a href="#"><u>format</u></a>	Especially in computing arrange or put into a format. <i>A data file in binary <b>format</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>frame</u></a>	A structural environment within which a class of words or other linguistic units can be correctly used For example I him is a frame for a large class of transitive verbs. <i>An old bicycle <b>frame</b>.</i>
<b>framework</b>	A basic structure underlying a system, concept, or text. <i>The theoretical <b>framework</b> of political sociology.</i>
<b>grammar</b>	A grammar school. <i>The <b>grammar</b> of wine.</i>
<a href="#"><u>indent</u></a>	An indentation. <i>We were <b>indenting</b> for paper clips one by one in those days.</i>
<b>infinitive</b>	The basic form of a verb, without an inflection binding it to a particular subject or tense (e.g. see in we came to see, let him see). <i><b>Infinitive</b> clauses.</i>

<b><u>juxtaposition</u></b>	The act of positioning close together (or side by side). <i>The <b>juxtaposition</b> of these two images.</i>
<b>litotes</b>	Ironic understatement in which an affirmative is expressed by the negative of its contrary (e.g. I shan't be sorry for I shall be glad). <i>Saying <i>I was not a little upset when you mean I was very upset</i> is an example of <b>litotes</b>.</i>
<b>morphological</b>	Relating to or concerned with the formation of admissible words in a language. <i><b>Morphological</b> and syntactic similarities between languages.</i>
<b>paragraph</b>	Divide into paragraphs as of text. <i>The concluding <b>paragraph</b>.</i>
<b><u>parse</u></b>	Analyze syntactically by assigning a constituent structure to (a sentence). <i>A user question input is <b>parsed</b> into an internal conceptual representation.</i>
<b><u>pathology</u></b>	Mental, social, or linguistic abnormality or malfunction. <i>The dominant <b>pathology</b> is multiple sclerosis.</i>
<b>phonetics</b>	The branch of acoustics concerned with speech processes including its production and perception and acoustic analysis. <i>A <b>phonetics</b> laboratory.</i>
<b>phrase</b>	Divide combine or mark into phrases. <i>It s important to <b>phrase</b> the question correctly.</i>
<b>sentence</b>	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>Slander of an official carried an eight year prison <b>sentence</b>.</i>
<b><u>shape</u></b>	Shape or influence give direction to. <i>Her lips <b>shaped</b> barely audible words.</i>
<b>structural</b>	Pertaining to geological structure. <i><b>Structural</b> damage.</i>
<b>structure</b>	Give a structure to. <i>His lectures have no <b>structure</b>.</i>
<b><u>surface</u></b>	Rise or come up to the surface of the water or the ground. <i>I hope the list key is going to <b>surface</b> again.</i>
<b><u>syntax</u></b>	A set of rules for or an analysis of the syntax of a language. <i>The <b>syntax</b> of English.</i>
<b>verb</b>	Use a word that is not conventionally used as a verb typically a noun as a verb. <i>Any English noun can be <b>verbed</b> but some are more resistant than others.</i>

<b>vivisection</b>	The practice of performing operations on live animals for the purpose of experimentation or scientific research (used only by opponents of such work. <i>The abolition of <b>vivisection</b>.</i>
<b>vocabulary</b>	The body of words used in a particular language. <i>The Sanskrit <b>vocabulary</b>.</i>
