- *A virus disease that results in leaf variegation in tobacco, maize, sugar cane, and other plants.*
- *An individual (especially an animal) composed of cells of two genetically different types.*
- *A freeware browser.*
- *A combination of diverse elements forming a more or less coherent whole.*
- *Arrangement of aerial photographs forming a composite picture.*
- *A pattern resembling a mosaic.*
- *Art consisting of a design made of small pieces of colored stone or glass.*
- *A colourful and variegated pattern.*
- *A picture or pattern produced by arranging together small pieces of stone, tile, glass, etc.*

- *Viral disease in solanaceous plants (tomatoes, potatoes, tobacco) resulting in mottling and often shriveling of the leaves.*

<b>farrago</b>	A motley assortment of things. <i>A <b>farrago</b> of fact and myth about Abraham Lincoln.</i>
<b>hash</b>	A mixture of jumbled incongruous things; a mess. <i>A <b>hash</b> of raw tomatoes chillies and coriander.</i>
<b><u>hodgepodge</u></b>	A motley assortment of things. <i>Rob s living room was a <b>hodgepodge</b> of modern furniture and antiques.</i>
<b>hotchpotch</b>	A confused mixture. <i>A <b>hotchpotch</b> of uncoordinated services.</i>
<b>jumble</b>	Articles collected for a jumble sale. <i>We are collecting <b>jumble</b> for charity.</i>
<b>medley</b>	A musical composition consisting of a series of songs or other musical pieces from various sources. <i>The junior 4×50 m <b>medley</b> relay.</i>
<b>melange</b>	A motley assortment of things. <i>A <b>melange</b> of tender vegetables and herbs.</i>
<b>miscellany</b>	A group or collection of different items; a mixture. <i>A <b>miscellany</b> of houses.</i>
<b>mishmash</b>	A motley assortment of things. <i>A <b>mishmash</b> of outmoded ideas.</i>
<b>mix</b>	A version of a recording in which the component tracks are mixed in a different way from the original. <i>A group of young women groove in a circle to a DJ <b>mix</b> of Missy Elliot the Young Gunz and Kelis.</i>
<b><u>mixture</u></b>	An event that combines things in a mixture. <i>A gradual <b>mixture</b> of cultures.</i>
<b>motley collection</b>	A garment made of motley (especially a court jester's costume).
<b>patchwork</b>	A quilt made by sewing patches of different materials together. <i>A <b>patchwork</b> of stone walls and green fields.</i>
<b>photomosaic</b>	Arrangement of aerial photographs forming a composite picture.
<b>pot-pourri</b>	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things.
<b>ragbag</b>	A bag in which scraps of fabric and old clothes are kept for use. <i>A <b>ragbag</b> of reforms is now being discussed.</i>

<b>art</b>	The products of human creativity works of art collectively. <i>His collection of modern <b>art</b>.</i>
<b>blotch</b>	Cover with blotches. <i>Her face was <b>blotched</b> and swollen with crying.</i>
<b>coloring</b>	The act or process of changing the color of something.
<b>dappled</b>	Marked with spots or rounded patches. <i>The horse s <b>dappled</b> flank.</i>
<b>decorated</b>	Provided with something intended to increase its beauty or distinction.
<b>dotted</b>	Marked with or in the form of dots. <i>A <b>dotted</b> background.</i>
<b>fleck</b>	Mark or dot with small patches of colour or particles of something. <i>A <b>fleck</b> of red.</i>

<b>fresco</b>	The method of painting frescoes used in Roman times and by the great masters of the Italian Renaissance including Giotto Raphael and Michelangelo. <i>Four scenes had been <b>frescoed</b> on the wall.</i>
<b>kiln</b>	A furnace or oven for burning, baking, or drying, especially one for calcining lime or firing pottery.
<b><u>masterpiece</u></b>	A piece of work by a craftsman accepted as qualification for membership of a guild as an acknowledged master. <i>A great literary <b>masterpiece</b>.</i>
<b><u>mild</u></b>	Humble in spirit or manner suggesting retiring mildness or even cowed submissiveness. <i>A <b>mild</b> sedative.</i>
<b>mottle</b>	A spot or patch forming part of a mottled arrangement. <i>It was not dull grey as distance had suggested but a <b>mottle</b> of khaki and black and olive green.</i>
<b>mottled</b>	Having spots or patches of color. <i>A bird with <b>mottled</b> brown plumage.</i>
<b>mural</b>	Relating to or resembling a wall. <i><b>Mural</b> thrombosis.</i>
<b>muralist</b>	A painter of murals.
<b><u>paint</u></b>	Make a painting of. <i>She couldn't have been more than fourteen but her face was thickly <b>painted</b>.</i>
<b><u>painting</u></b>	A painted picture. <i>You can finish the job of <b>painting</b> faster with a roller than with a brush.</i>
<b>patterned</b>	Having patterns (especially colorful patterns). <i>She wore leather trousers and a <b>patterned</b> shirt.</i>
<b>slate</b>	A flat plate of slate formerly used for writing on in schools. <i>He <b>slated</b> his talk for 9 AM.</i>
<b>speckle</b>	A small spot or patch of colour. <i><b>Speckle</b> the wall with tiny yellow spots.</i>
<b>plotch</b>	Blotch or spot. <i>A <b>splotch</b> of red in a larger area of yellow.</i>
<b><u>spot</u></b>	Mark or become marked with spots. <i>I'll <b>spot</b> you 300.</i>
<b><u>spotted</u></b>	Having spots or patches (small areas of contrasting color or texture). <i>A black and white <b>spotted</b> cow.</i>

<b>streak</b>	Cover a surface with streaks. <i>The theatre is on a winning <b>streak</b>.</i>
<b>striped</b>	Marked or decorated with stripes. <i>A green <b>striped</b> coat.</i>
<b>tessellated</b>	Having a checkered or mottled appearance. <i>A <b>tessellated</b> pavement.</i>
<b>tile</b>	Cover with tiles. <i><b>Tile</b> the wall and the floor of the bathroom.</i>
<b>variegated</b>	Marked by variety. <i><b>Variegated</b> yellow bricks.</i>
<b>vitreous</b>	Having the surface made shiny and nonporous by fusing a vitreous solution to it. <i><b>Vitreous</b> china.</i>
<b>vitriify</b>	Change into glass or a glass-like substance by applying heat. <i>The option of <b>vitriifying</b> nuclear waste presents problems.</i>
