### Definitions of "Motif" as a noun

- *A design or figure that consists of recurring shapes or colors, as in architecture or decoration.*
- *A dominant or recurring idea in an artistic work.*
- *A distinctive sequence on a protein or DNA, having a three-dimensional structure that allows binding interactions to occur.*
- *A theme that is repeated or elaborated in a piece of music.*
- *A decorative device applied to a garment or textile.*
- *A leitmotif or figure.*
- *A decorative image or design, especially a repeated one forming a pattern.*
- *A unifying idea that is a recurrent element in literary or artistic work.*

- badge** A feature or sign which reveals a particular quality.

- coat of arms** A thin layer covering something.

*A new **concept** in corporate hospitality.*
- crest** The upper line of the neck of a horse or other mammal.  
*Biopsy specimens of the iliac **crest** were obtained under local anaesthesia.*
- decoration** The act of decorating something (in the hope of making it more attractive).  
*The lavish **decoration** of cloth with gilt.*
- design** A preliminary sketch indicating the plan for something.  
*Good **design** can help the reader understand complicated information.*

<b>device</b>	Any ornamental pattern or design (as in embroidery). <i>The decorative <b>device</b> on the invitations.</i>
<b>element</b>	Each of more than one hundred substances that cannot be chemically interconverted or broken down into simpler substances and are primary constituents of matter Each element is distinguished by its atomic number i.e. the number of protons in the nuclei of its atoms. <i>In your <b>element</b>.</i>
<b><u>emblem</u></b>	A heraldic device or symbolic object as a distinctive badge of a nation, organization, or family. <i>America's national <b>emblem</b> the bald eagle.</i>
<b>escutcheon</b>	A flat piece of metal for protection and often ornamentation, around a keyhole, door handle, or light switch.
<b>figure</b>	One of the elements that collectively form a system of numeration. <i>A heroic <b>figure</b>.</i>
<b><u>hallmark</u></b>	A mark on an article of trade to indicate its origin and authenticity. <i>The tiny bubbles are the <b>hallmark</b> of fine champagnes.</i>
<b>idea</b>	(music) melodic subject of a musical composition. <i>The accompanist picked up the <b>idea</b> and elaborated it.</i>
<b>ideogram</b>	A graphic character that indicates the meaning of a thing without indicating the sounds used to say it. <i>Chinese characters are <b>ideograms</b>.</i>
<b>insignia</b>	A badge worn to show official position. <i>The ruins are devoid of moss and ivy the romantic <b>insignia</b> of age and decay.</i>
<b>leitmotif</b>	A melodic phrase that accompanies the reappearance of a person or situation (as in Wagner's operas). <i>There are two <b>leitmotifs</b> in his score marking the heroine and her Fairy Godmother.</i>
<b><u>logo</u></b>	A symbol or other small design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc. <i>The Olympic <b>logo</b> was emblazoned across the tracksuits.</i>
<b>logogram</b>	A single written symbol that represents an entire word or phrase without indicating its pronunciation. <i>7 is a <b>logogram</b> that is pronounced seven in English and nanatsu in Japanese.</i>
<b>logotype</b>	A single piece of type that prints a word, a group of separate letters, or a logo.

<b>mark</b>	A marking that consists of lines that cross each other. <i>His arrow hit the <b>mark</b>.</i>
<b>monogram</b>	A motif of two or more interwoven letters, typically a person's initials, used to identify a personal possession or as a logo. <i>A handkerchief with his <b>monogram</b> embroidered on one corner.</i>
<u><b>motive</b></u>	A design or figure that consists of recurring shapes or colors, as in architecture or decoration. <i>He acted with the best of <b>motives</b>.</i>
<b>motto</b>	A phrase which recurs throughout a musical work and has some symbolical significance. <i>They were developing the use of leitmotifs or <b>mottoes</b> that appear throughout an opera.</i>
<b>ornament</b>	A thing used or serving to make something look more attractive but usually having no practical purpose, especially a small object such as a figurine. <i>Tables covered with <b>ornaments</b> and books.</i>
<b>pattern</b>	Graphical representation (in polar or Cartesian coordinates) of the spatial distribution of radiation from an antenna as a function of angle. <i>It is easier to choose carpets from the roll than from a <b>pattern</b> book.</i>
<b>rune</b>	A section of the Kalevala or of an ancient Scandinavian poem. <i>The casting of the <b>runes</b>.</i>
<b>seal</b>	A design resembling a seal embossed in paper as a guarantee of authenticity. <i>For most domestic applications a 75 mm <b>seal</b> is required.</i>
<u><b>shape</b></u>	The state of good health especially in the phrases in condition or in shape or out of condition or out of shape. <i>A fiend in human <b>shape</b>.</i>
<b>stamp</b>	An instrument for stamping a pattern or mark in particular an engraved or inked block or die. <i>TV licence <b>stamps</b>.</i>
<u><b>subject</b></u>	A person who is subjected to experimental or other observational procedures someone who is an object of investigation. <i>The incident was the <b>subject</b> of international condemnation.</i>
<u><b>symbol</b></u>	A shape or sign used to represent something such as an organization, e.g. a red cross or a Star of David. <i>The Red Cross <b>symbol</b>.</i>
<u><b>tag</b></u>	A short phrase or clause added to an already complete sentence, as in I like it, I do. <i>You can easily add <b>tags</b> to photos en masse.</i>

<b>theme</b>	(music) melodic subject of a musical composition. <i>A <b>theme</b> song.</i>
<b>token</b>	A voucher that can be exchanged for goods or services, typically one given as a gift or forming part of a promotional offer. <i>A record <b>token</b>.</i>
<b>topic</b>	That part of a sentence about which something is said, typically the first major constituent. <i>He kept drifting off the <b>topic</b>.</i>
<b>trademark</b>	A symbol, word, or words legally registered or established by use as representing a company or product. <i>The murder had all the <b>trademarks</b> of a Mafia hit.</i>
<b>trope</b>	A significant or recurrent theme; a motif. <i>My sense that philosophy has become barren is a recurrent <b>trope</b> of modern philosophy.</i>

<b>aesthetics</b>	The branch of philosophy dealing with beauty and taste (emphasizing the evaluative criteria that are applied to art. <i>Traditional <b>aesthetics</b> assumed the existence of universal and timeless criteria of artistic value.</i>
<b>algebra</b>	A system of algebra based on given axioms. <i>Courses in <b>algebra</b> geometry and Newtonian physics.</i>
<b>algebraic</b>	Of or relating to algebra. <i><b>Algebraic</b> geometry.</i>
<b>arithmetic</b>	Relating to or involving arithmetic. <i>The laws of <b>arithmetic</b>.</i>
<b>binary</b>	The binary system of notation. <i>A <b>binary</b> star is a system in which two stars revolve around each other.</i>
<b>calculus</b>	The branch of mathematics that deals with the finding and properties of derivatives and integrals of functions by methods originally based on the summation of infinitesimal differences The two main types are differential calculus and integral calculus. <i>Biliary <b>calculi</b>.</i>
<b>chassis</b>	The skeleton of a motor vehicle consisting of a steel frame supported on springs that holds the body and motor.

<b>decimal</b>	A fraction whose denominator is a power of ten and whose numerator is expressed by figures placed to the right of a decimal point. <i>Write these <b>decimals</b> as vulgar fractions.</i>
<b>denominator</b>	A figure representing the total population in terms of which statistical values are expressed.
<b>design</b>	Create designs. <i>The appearance of <b>design</b> in the universe.</i>
<b>digit</b>	One of the elements that collectively form a system of numeration. <i>0 and 1 are <b>digits</b>.</i>
<b><u>equation</u></b>	A situation in which several factors must be taken into account. <i>The <b>equation</b> of science with objectivity.</i>
<b>equilateral</b>	Having all its sides of the same length. <i>An <b>equilateral</b> triangle.</i>
<b>exponential</b>	(of an increase) becoming more and more rapid. <i>An <b>exponential</b> curve.</i>
<b>figure</b>	The property possessed by a sum or total or indefinite quantity of units or individuals. <i>A clock with a <b>figured</b> mahogany case.</i>
<b>floral</b>	A fabric with a floral design. <i>An unusual <b>floral</b> design.</i>
<b>geometer</b>	A mathematician specializing in geometry.
<b>geometric</b>	A geometric pattern. <i>A <b>geometric</b> pattern.</i>
<b>geometry</b>	A particular system of geometry. <i>The <b>geometry</b> of spiders webs.</i>
<b>hyperbolic</b>	Enlarged beyond truth or reasonableness. <i>A <b>hyperbolic</b> style.</i>
<b>math</b>	Mathematics. <i>She teaches <b>math</b> and science.</i>
<b>mathematics</b>	The abstract science of number quantity and space either as abstract concepts pure mathematics or as applied to other disciplines such as physics and engineering applied mathematics. <i>James immerses himself in the <b>mathematics</b> of baseball.</i>
<b>multiplication</b>	The process or skill of multiplying. <i>These formulae involve a number of <b>multiplications</b>.</i>
<b><u>multiply</u></b>	Have young (animals) or reproduce (organisms). <i>He managed to <b>multiply</b> his profits.</i>

<b><u>number</u></b>	Place a limit on the number of. <i>Yvonne was wearing a little black <b>number</b>.</i>
<b>numerate</b>	Able to understand and use numbers. <i>Teachers should ensure that their pupils are literate and <b>numerate</b>.</i>
<b>photometer</b>	Measuring instrument for measuring the luminous intensity of a source by comparing it (visually or photoelectrically) with a standard source.
<b>pi</b>	Relating to or denoting an electron or orbital with one unit of angular momentum about an internuclear axis. <i>The <math>\pi</math> orbital system of the benzene molecule.</i>
<b>theta</b>	The eighth letter of the Greek alphabet ( $\Theta$ , $\theta$ ), transliterated as 'th'. <i><b>Theta</b> Draconis.</i>
<b><u>times</u></b>	An arithmetic operation that is the inverse of division; the product of two numbers is computed. <i>It was a sign of the <b>times</b>.</i>
