## Synonyms of "Motionless" as an adjective (19 Words)

<b>frozen</b>	(used of foods) preserved by freezing sufficiently rapidly to retain flavor and nutritional value. <i><b>Frozen</b> foods.</i>
<b>halted</b>	Disabled in the feet or legs.
<b>immobile</b>	Securely fixed in place. <i>An <b>immobile</b> workforce.</i>
<b>immovable</b>	(of property) consisting of land, buildings, or other permanent items. <i>All <b>immovable</b> objects have graffiti sprayed on them.</i>
<b>inactive</b>	Not engaging in political or other activity. <i>Dreamy and <b>inactive</b> by nature.</i>
<b>inanimate</b>	Belonging to the class of nouns denoting nonliving things. <i>The word car is <b>inanimate</b>.</i>
<b>inert</b>	Lacking the ability or strength to move. <i><b>Inert</b> matter.</i>
<b>lifeless</b>	Lacking animation or excitement or activity. <i>The <b>lifeless</b> landscapes of the moon.</i>
<b>not moving a muscle</b>	Used of a series of photographs presented so as to create the illusion of motion.
<b>paralysed</b>	(of a person or part of the body) partly or wholly incapable of movement; disabled. <i>He became partially <b>paralysed</b>.</i>
<b>quiescent</b>	Not active or activated. <i>The <b>quiescent</b> level of centimeter wave length solar radiation.</i>
<b>rooted to the spot</b>	Absolutely still.
<b>static</b>	Concerned with or producing or caused by static electricity. <i>An <b>electrostatic</b> generator produces high voltage <b>static</b> electricity.</i>
<b>stationary</b>	Standing still. <i>A car collided with a <b>stationary</b> vehicle.</i>
<b>still</b>	(of a body of water) free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>A <b>still</b> autumn day.</i>
<b>stock-still</b>	Absolutely still.
<b>stopped</b>	(of a nose) blocked. <i>A <b>stopped</b> or <b>stopped</b> up nose.</i>
<b>transfixed</b>	Having your attention fixated as though by a spell.

**unmoving**

Not stirring any emotion.

*This must be the most **unmoving** performance of Verdi's opera ever recorded.*

## Associations of "Motionless" (30 Words)

- already** Used after a word or phrase to express impatience.  
*Anna has suffered a great deal **already**.*
- complacency** A feeling of smug or uncritical satisfaction with oneself or one's achievements.  
*His **complacency** was absolutely disgusting.*
- confirmed** Having been established or made firm or received the rite of confirmation.  
*A **confirmed** invalid.*

<b>constancy</b>	The quality of being enduring and free from change or variation. <i>She did not think much of married bliss yet she approved of <b>constancy</b>.</i>
<b>fixed</b>	Fixed and unmoving. <i>A <b>fixed</b> iron ladder down the port side.</i>
<b>idleness</b>	The quality of lacking substance or value. <i>He was punished for his <b>idleness</b> at school.</i>
<b>immobile</b>	Not capable of movement or of being moved. <i>She sat <b>immobile</b> for a long time.</i>
<b><u>immovable</u></b>	Immovable property. <i>All <b>immovable</b> objects have graffiti sprayed on them.</i>
<b><u>inaction</u></b>	Lack of action where some is expected or appropriate. <i>Future generations will condemn us for <b>inaction</b>.</i>
<b>inactive</b>	Not exerting influence or change. <i>An <b>inactive</b> member.</i>
<b>inactivity</b>	The state of being inactive; idleness. <i>Don't suddenly take up violent exercise after years of <b>inactivity</b>.</i>
<b><u>inert</u></b>	Unable to move or resist motion. <i>She lay <b>inert</b> in her bed.</i>
<b>lull</b>	A pause during which things are calm or activities are diminished. <i>The rhythm of the boat <b>lulled</b> her to sleep.</i>
<b><u>nonetheless</u></b>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession). <i>The rally which the government had declared illegal was <b>nonetheless</b> attended by some 6 000.</i>
<b>preside</b>	Act as president. <i>The prime minister will <b>preside</b> at an emergency cabinet meeting.</i>
<b>prudish</b>	Having or revealing a tendency to be easily shocked by matters relating to sex or nudity; excessively concerned with sexual propriety. <i>The <b>prudish</b> moral climate of the late 19th century.</i>
<b>quiescence</b>	Inactivity or dormancy. <i>This method has been shown to induce sleep like <b>quiescence</b> in adult animals.</i>
<b>quiescent</b>	(pathology) causing no symptoms. <i>A <b>quiescent</b> tumor.</i>
<b><u>sedentary</u></b>	Requiring sitting or little activity. <i>A tribe of <b>sedentary</b> agriculturists.</i>
<b>settled</b>	Not changeable. <i>With details of the wedding <b>settled</b> she could now sleep at night.</i>

<b>standing</b>	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>Two teams desperate to improve their league <b>standings</b>.</i>
<b><u>static</u></b>	Relating to statics. <i>She felt the tingle of <b>static</b> from the cat's fur.</i>
<b>statics</b>	The branch of mechanics concerned with bodies at rest and forces in equilibrium.
<b><u>stationary</u></b>	Not changing in quantity or condition. <i>A <b>stationary</b> population.</i>
<b>steadfast</b>	Resolutely or dutifully firm and unwavering. <i><b>Steadfast</b> resolve.</i>
<b><u>stiff</u></b>	In a stiff manner. <i>His hands lay <b>stiffly</b>.</i>
<b>still</b>	Make or become still quieten. <i>He <b>still</b> lives with his mother.</i>
<b>tranquilize</b>	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to.
<b>unmoving</b>	Not moving; still. <i>This must be the most <b>unmoving</b> performance of Verdi's opera ever recorded.</i>
<b>unshakable</b>	Without flaws or loopholes.
