<a href="#">amazement</a>	The feeling that accompanies something extremely surprising. <i>To her <b>amazement</b> Bill was keen.</i>
amusing	Providing enjoyment; pleasantly entertaining. <i>An <b>amusing</b> film with a steady stream of pranks and pratfalls.</i>
<a href="#">awe</a>	Capacity to inspire awe. <i>The sight filled me with <b>awe</b>.</i>
catalyst	A substance that initiates or accelerates a chemical reaction without itself being affected. <i>The prime minister s speech acted as a <b>catalyst</b> for debate.</i>
encourage	Contribute to the progress or growth of. <i>The intention is to <b>encourage</b> new writing talent.</i>
<a href="#">entertaining</a>	Providing amusement or enjoyment. <i>Films should be <b>entertaining</b>.</i>
exciting	Stimulating interest and discussion. <i>An <b>exciting</b> novel.</i>
<a href="#">exhilarating</a>	Making lively and joyful. <i>The <b>exhilarating</b> effect of mountain air.</i>
funny	Slightly but undefinably unwell. <i>A very <b>funny</b> writer.</i>
<a href="#">hilarious</a>	Extremely amusing. <i>The meal was noisy and <b>hilarious</b>.</i>
humor	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>The <b>humors</b> are blood and phlegm and yellow and black bile.</i>
humorous	Full of or characterized by humor. <i>A <b>humorous</b> and entertaining talk.</i>
<a href="#">inspiring</a>	Having the effect of inspiring someone. <i>The scenery is not very <b>inspiring</b>.</i>

<b>interesting</b>	Arousing curiosity or interest; holding or catching the attention. <i>An <b>interesting</b> debate.</i>
<b>invigorating</b>	Imparting strength and vitality. <i>The <b>invigorating</b> mountain air.</i>
<b>jocular</b>	With humor. <i>His voice was <b>jocular</b>.</i>
<b>laughing</b>	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i><b>Laughing</b> children.</i>
<b>live</b>	Have life be alive. <i>A <b>live</b> bomb.</i>
<b>pleasant</b>	(of a person or their manner) friendly and considerate; likeable. <i>I didn't enjoy it and probably wasn't a <b>pleasant</b> person to be around.</i>
<b>repartee</b>	Conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. <i>He had a quick mind and a splendid gift of <b>repartee</b>.</i>
<b>rousing</b>	Rousing to activity or heightened action as by spurring or goading. <i>Tossed a <b>rousing</b> political comment into the conversation.</i>
<b>slapstick</b>	Characterized by horseplay and physical action. <i>A loud and exhilarating rattle of bladders and <b>slapsticks</b>.</i>
<b>stimulating</b>	Encouraging or arousing interest or enthusiasm. <i>A <b>stimulating</b> discussion.</i>
<b>stimulus</b>	A thing or event that evokes a specific functional reaction in an organ or tissue. <i>She loved the <b>stimulus</b> of the job.</i>
<b>surprise</b>	Cause to be surprised. <i><b>Surprise</b> major.</i>
<b>titillate</b>	Excite pleasurably or erotically. <i>The press are paid to <b>titillate</b> the public.</i>
<b>will</b>	Pronounced stressing will indicating annoyance about the habitual behaviour described. <i>Where there's a <b>will</b> there's a way.</i>
<b>wit</b>	A witty amusing person who makes jokes. <i>She is such a <b>wit</b>.</i>
<b>witticism</b>	A message whose ingenuity or verbal skill or incongruity has the power to evoke laughter. <i>Maurice roared with laughter at his own <b>witticisms</b>.</i>
<b>wonder</b>	Something that causes feelings of wonder. <i>You're all a bunch of gutless <b>wonders</b>.</i>
