amazement	The feeling that accompanies something extremely surprising. <i>To her amazement Bill was keen.</i>
amusing	Providing enjoyment; pleasantly entertaining. <i>An amusing film with a steady stream of pranks and pratfalls.</i>
awe	Capacity to inspire awe. <i>The sight filled me with awe.</i>
catalyst	A substance that initiates or accelerates a chemical reaction without itself being affected. <i>The prime minister s speech acted as a catalyst for debate.</i>
encourage	Contribute to the progress or growth of. <i>The intention is to encourage new writing talent.</i>
entertaining	Providing amusement or enjoyment. <i>Films should be entertaining.</i>
exciting	Stimulating interest and discussion. <i>An exciting novel.</i>
exhilarating	Making lively and joyful. <i>The exhilarating effect of mountain air.</i>
funny	Slightly but undefinably unwell. <i>A very funny writer.</i>
hilarious	Extremely amusing. <i>The meal was noisy and hilarious.</i>
humor	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>The humors are blood and phlegm and yellow and black bile.</i>
humorous	Full of or characterized by humor. <i>A humorous and entertaining talk.</i>
inspiring	Having the effect of inspiring someone. <i>The scenery is not very inspiring.</i>

interesting	Arousing curiosity or interest; holding or catching the attention. <i>An interesting debate.</i>
invigorating	Imparting strength and vitality. <i>The invigorating mountain air.</i>
jocular	With humor. <i>His voice was jocular.</i>
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>
live	Have life be alive. <i>A live bomb.</i>
pleasant	(of a person or their manner) friendly and considerate; likeable. <i>I didn't enjoy it and probably wasn't a pleasant person to be around.</i>
repartee	Conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. <i>He had a quick mind and a splendid gift of repartee.</i>
rousing	Rousing to activity or heightened action as by spurring or goading. <i>Tossed a rousing political comment into the conversation.</i>
slapstick	Characterized by horseplay and physical action. <i>A loud and exhilarating rattle of bladders and slapsticks.</i>
stimulating	Encouraging or arousing interest or enthusiasm. <i>A stimulating discussion.</i>
stimulus	A thing or event that evokes a specific functional reaction in an organ or tissue. <i>She loved the stimulus of the job.</i>
surprise	Cause to be surprised. <i>Surprise major.</i>
titillate	Excite pleasurable or erotically. <i>The press are paid to titillate the public.</i>
will	Pronounced stressing will indicating annoyance about the habitual behaviour described. <i>Where there's a will there's a way.</i>
wit	A witty amusing person who makes jokes. <i>She is such a wit.</i>
witticism	A message whose ingenuity or verbal skill or incongruity has the power to evoke laughter. <i>Maurice roared with laughter at his own witticisms.</i>
wonder	Something that causes feelings of wonder. <i>You're all a bunch of gutless wonders.</i>
