Associations of "Mourned" (30 Words)

alas	By bad luck. <i>Alas I cannot stay.</i>
bemoan	Regret strongly. <i>It was no use bemoaning her lot.</i>
deplorable	Bringing or deserving severe rebuke or censure. <i>A deplorable act of violence.</i>
deplore	Express strong disapproval of. <i>We deplore all violence.</i>
dirge	A song or piece of music that is considered too slow, miserable, or boring. <i>The wind howled dirges around the chimney.</i>
doleful	Expressing sorrow; mournful. <i>He could be struck off with doleful consequences.</i>
elegy	(in modern literature) a poem of serious reflection, typically a lament for the dead.
grief	An instance or cause of intense sorrow. <i>She was overcome with grief.</i>
grieve	Feel intense sorrow. <i>It grieves me to think of you in that house alone.</i>
horrible	Provoking horror- Winston Churchill. <i>The tea tasted horrible.</i>
howl	Make a howling sound. <i>Howls of laughter.</i>
jeremiad	A long and mournful complaint. <i>A jeremiad against any form of government.</i>
lament	A mournful poem a lament for the dead. <i>He was lamenting the death of his infant daughter.</i>

lamentation	A cry of sorrow and grief. <i>Scenes of lamentation.</i>
maudlin	(of a book, film, or song) highly sentimental. <i>Maudlin expressions of sympathy.</i>
moan	A sound resembling a human moan. <i>Passengers moaned about overcrowded coaches.</i>
mournful	Feeling, expressing, or inducing sadness, regret, or grief. <i>Her large mournful eyes.</i>
mourning	The passionate and demonstrative activity of expressing grief. <i>She s still in mourning after the death of her husband.</i>
plaintive	Sounding sad and mournful. <i>A plaintive cry.</i>
requiem	A musical composition setting parts of a requiem Mass or of a similar character. <i>The musical tradition of the requiem mass has inspired imitation.</i>
sad	Of things that make you feel sad Christina Rossetti. <i>It was a very sad story.</i>
sadly	To a regrettable extent; regrettably. <i>Sadly he died before he could see his grandchild.</i>
sadness	The condition or quality of being sad. <i>She tired of his perpetual sadness.</i>
sorrow	An event or circumstance that causes sorrow. <i>He drank to drown his sorrows.</i>
sorry	Causing dejection. <i>He looks a sorry sight with his broken jaw.</i>
threnody	A lament. <i>A brooding threnody to urban desolation.</i>
tragic	Very bad or inadequate. <i>She wears tragic cardigans usually done up the wrong way.</i>
wail	Utter a wail. <i>She wailed her wretched life.</i>
weep	A fit or period of weeping. <i>A young widow weeping her lost lord.</i>
whimper	A whimpering sound. <i>Their first appearance in the top flight ended with a whimper rather than a bang.</i>
