(of a book, film, or song) highly sentimental. maudlin

Maudlin expressions of sympathy.

A sound resembling a human moan. moan

Passengers **moan**ed about overcrowded coaches.

Feeling, expressing, or inducing sadness, regret, or grief. mournful

Her large **mournful** eyes.

The passionate and demonstrative activity of expressing grief. mourning

She s still in **mourning** after the death of her husband.

Sounding sad and mournful. <u>plaintive</u>

A plaintive cry.

A musical composition setting parts of a requiem Mass or of a similar

requiem character.
