<u>alas</u>	By bad luck. Alas I cannot stay.
bemoan	Regret strongly. It was no use bemoan ing her lot.
deplorable	Bringing or deserving severe rebuke or censure. A deplorable act of violence.
deplore	Express strong disapproval of. We deplore all violence.
dirge	A song or piece of music that is considered too slow, miserable, or boring. The wind howled dirge s around the chimney.
doleful	Expressing sorrow; mournful. He could be struck off with doleful consequences.
elegy	(in modern literature) a poem of serious reflection, typically a lament for the dead.
<u>grief</u>	An instance or cause of intense sorrow. <i>She was overcome with grief.</i>
grieve	Feel intense sorrow. It grieve s me to think of you in that house alone.
horrible	Provoking horror- Winston Churchill. The tea tasted horrible .
howl	Make a howling sound. <i>Howl</i> s of laughter.
jeremiad	A long and mournful complaint. A jeremiad against any form of government.
lament	A mournful poem a lament for the dead. He was lament ing the death of his infant daughter.



lamentation	A cry of sorrow and grief. Scenes of lamentation .
maudlin	(of a book, film, or song) highly sentimental. <i>Maudlin</i> expressions of sympathy.
moan	A sound resembling a human moan. Passengers moan ed about overcrowded coaches.
mournful	Feeling, expressing, or inducing sadness, regret, or grief. <i>Her large mournful eyes.</i>
mourning	The passionate and demonstrative activity of expressing grief. She s still in mourning after the death of her husband.
<u>plaintive</u>	Sounding sad and mournful. A plaintive cry.
requiem	A musical composition setting parts of a requiem Mass or of a similar character. The musical tradition of the requiem mass has inspired imitation.
sad	Of things that make you feel sad Christina Rossetti. It was a very sad story.
sadly	To a regrettable extent; regrettably. Sadly he died before he could see his grandchild.
sadness	The condition or quality of being sad. She tired of his perpetual sadness .
<u>sorrow</u>	An event or circumstance that causes sorrow. <i>He drank to drown his sorrows.</i>
<u>sorry</u>	Causing dejection. He looks a sorry sight with his broken jaw.
threnody	A lament. A brooding threnody to urban desolation.
<u>tragic</u>	Very bad or inadequate. She wears tragic cardigans usually done up the wrong way.
wail	Utter a wail. She wail ed her wretched life.
<u>weep</u>	A fit or period of weeping. A young widow weep ing her lost lord.
<u>whimper</u>	A whimpering sound. Their first appearance in the top flight ended with a whimper rather than a bang.
