| <b>enormously</b>   | Extremely.<br><i>She has been <b>enormously</b> successful.</i>   |
| <b>galore</b>       | In great numbers.<br><i>Daffodils <b>galore</b>.</i>  |
| <b>greatly</b>      | By a considerable amount; very much.<br><i>I admire him <b>greatly</b>.</i>   |
| <b>highly</b>       | In a high position or level or rank.<br><i>He spoke <b>highly</b> of her.</i>   |
| <b>incalculable</b> | Too great to be calculated or estimated.<br><i>The odds against such an event are <b>incalculable</b>.</i>  |
| <b>innumerable</b>  | Too many to be counted (often used hyperbolically).<br><i><b>Innumerable</b> flags of all colours.</i>  |

| <b>lot</b>           | Divide items into lots for sale at an auction.<br><i>Eventually the <b>lot</b> fell on the King's daughter.</i>   |
| <b>many</b>          | A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by 'as' or 'too' or 'so' or 'that'; amounting to a large but indefinite number.<br><i>Too <b>many</b> clouds to see.</i> |
| <b>mellowness</b>    | The property of a sensation that is rich and pleasing.<br><i>A <b>mellowness</b> of light and shade not attainable in marble.</i>   |
| <b>more</b>          | Forming the comparative of adjectives and adverbs especially those of more than one syllable.<br><i><b>More</b> rain fell.</i>  |
| <b>most</b>          | Almost.<br><i>The <b>most</b> important event of my life.</i>   |
| <b>multiple</b>      | Having or involving or consisting of more than one part or entity or individual.<br><i>The major food <b>multiples</b>.</i>   |
| <b>multiplicity</b>  | A large number.<br><i>The demand for higher education depends on a <b>multiplicity</b> of factors.</i>  |
| <b>myriad</b>        | The cardinal number that is the product of ten and one thousand.<br><i><b>Myriads</b> of insects danced around the light above my head.</i>   |
| <b>numberless</b>    | Too numerous to be counted.<br><i>There are <b>numberless</b> questions to be asked.</i>  |
| <b>numerous</b>      | Amounting to a large indefinite number.<br><i><b>Numerous</b> times.</i>  |
| <b>outnumber</b>     | Be larger in number.<br><i>Women <b>outnumbered</b> men by three to one.</i>  |
| <b>plentiful</b>     | Existing in or yielding great quantities; abundant.<br><i>Rhinoceroses were once <b>plentiful</b> here.</i>   |
| <b>plenty</b>        | A situation in which food and other necessities are available in sufficiently large quantities.<br><i>There was <b>plenty</b> of food for everyone.</i>                                       |
| <b>plurality</b>     | The number by which plurality exceeds the number of votes cast for the candidate placed second.<br><i>A <b>plurality</b> of religions.</i>  |
| <b>profusion</b>     | An abundance or large quantity of something.<br><i>The <b>profusion</b> of detail.</i>  |
| <b>substantially</b> | To a great extent or degree.<br><i>Profits grew <b>substantially</b>.</i>   |
