galore	Existing in abundance. <i>Whiskey galore.</i>
greatly	By a considerable amount; very much. <i>They now have greatly increased powers.</i>
highly	To a high degree or extent; favorably or with much respect. <i>His colleagues think very highly of him.</i>
incalculable	Not capable of being computed or enumerated. <i>An archive of incalculable value.</i>

innumerable	Too many to be counted (often used hyperbolically). <i>Innumerable difficulties.</i>
lot	Divide into lots as of land for example. <i>Eventually the lot fell on the King's daughter.</i>
many	The majority of people. <i>A good many.</i>
moderately	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>The event was moderately successful.</i>
multiplicity	The property of being multiple. <i>The demand for higher education depends on a multiplicity of factors.</i>
myriad	Too numerous to be counted. <i>He gazed at the myriad lights of the city.</i>
numberless	Too numerous to be counted. <i>There are numberless questions to be asked.</i>
outnumber	Be more numerous than. <i>Women outnumbered men by three to one.</i>
plentiful	Affording an abundant supply. <i>Food is plentiful.</i>
plenty	A full supply. <i>There was plenty of food for everyone.</i>
pretty	Make pretty or attractive. <i>He led me a pretty dance.</i>
profusion	An abundance or large quantity of something. <i>The profusion of detail.</i>
quite	Actually or truly or to an extreme. <i>Quite soon.</i>
reasonably	Inexpensively. <i>Acted quite reasonably.</i>
richness	The property of a sensation that is rich and pleasing. <i>Tropical gardens with an enormous richness of flora and fauna.</i>
substantially	In a strong substantial way. <i>Profits grew substantially.</i>
untold	Too much to be measured. <i>Untold suffering.</i>
