enough	An adequate quantity a quantity that is large enough to achieve a purpose. <i>Enough</i> food.
<u>fairly</u>	To a moderately high degree. <i>He <b>fairly</b> snarled at her.</i>
galore	Existing in abundance. Whiskey <b>galore</b> .
greatly	By a considerable amount; very much. They now have <b>greatly</b> increased powers.
<u>highly</u>	To a high degree or extent; favorably or with much respect. <i>His colleagues think very <b>highly</b> of him.</i>
incalculable	Not capable of being computed or enumerated. An archive of <b>incalculable</b> value.



<u>innumerable</u>	Too many to be counted (often used hyperbolically. <i>Innumerable</i> difficulties.
lot	Divide into lots as of land for example. Eventually the <b>lot</b> fell on the King s daughter.
many	The majority of people. A good <b>many</b> .
<b>moderately</b>	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>The event was <b>moderately</b> successful.</i>
multiplicity	The property of being multiple. <i>The demand for higher education depends on a multiplicity of factors.</i>
<u>myriad</u>	Too numerous to be counted. <i>He gazed at the <b>myriad</b> lights of the city.</i>
numberless	Too numerous to be counted. There are <b>numberless</b> questions to be asked.
outnumber	Be more numerous than. Women <b>outnumber</b> ed men by three to one.
plentiful	Affording an abundant supply. Food is <b>plentiful</b> .
<u>plenty</u>	A full supply. There was <b>plenty</b> of food for everyone.
<u>pretty</u>	Make pretty or attractive. <i>He led me a <b>pretty</b> dance.</i>
profusion	An abundance or large quantity of something. The <b>profusion</b> of detail.
<u>quite</u>	Actually or truly or to an extreme. <i>Quite</i> soon.
reasonably	Inexpensively. Acted quite <b>reasonably</b> .
richness	The property of a sensation that is rich and pleasing. Tropical gardens with an enormous <b>richness</b> of flora and fauna.
substantially	In a strong substantial way. Profits grew <b>substantially</b> .
untold	Too much to be measured. <i>Untold</i> suffering.
