### Definitions of "Muffled" as an adjective

- *Wrapped up especially for protection or secrecy.*
- *Being or made softer or less loud or clear.*
- *(of a sound) not loud because of being obstructed in some way; muted.*



### Synonyms of "Muffled" as an adjective (3 Words)

**dull** (of business) not active or brisk.  
*His black hair looked **dull**.*

**muted** (of a musical instrument) having a muffled sound as a result of being fitted with a mute.  
*A dress in **muted** tones of powder blue and dusty pink.*

**softened** Toned down.

- *Children muffled almost to the eyebrows.*
- *The muffled noises of the street.*

- chocolate** A sweet made of or covered with chocolate.  
*A **chocolate** biscuit.*
- clement** (of a person or their actions) merciful.  
*It is a very **clement** day.*
- conspire** Engage in plotting or enter into a conspiracy, swear together.  
*They **conspired** against him.*

<b><u>covered</u></b>	Overlaid or spread or topped with or enclosed within something; sometimes used as a combining form. <i>Women with <b>covered</b> faces.</i>
<b><u>drenched</u></b>	Abundantly covered or supplied with; often used in combination. <i><b>Drenched</b> in moonlight.</i>
<b><u>dusty</u></b>	Covered with a layer of dust. <i>A <b>dusty</b> pile of books.</i>
<b>elasticity</b>	Ability to change and adapt; adaptability. <i>Aging can decrease the <b>elasticity</b> of your skin.</i>
<b>fluffy</b>	Of, like, or covered with fluff. <i><b>Fluffy</b> white clouds.</i>
<b><u>fuzzy</u></b>	Confused and not coherent; not clearly thought out. <i>The picture is very <b>fuzzy</b>.</i>
<b><u>hidden</u></b>	Not accessible to view. <i>A <b>hidden</b> cave.</i>
<b>hide</b>	Be or go into hiding; keep out of sight, as for protection and safety. <i>Herbert could hardly <b>hide</b> his dislike.</i>
<b>mellow</b>	In a mellow manner. <i>To most farmers soil has good tilth when it is <b>mellow</b> and granular and crumbles easily in the hand.</i>
<b>moisturize</b>	Make (something, especially the skin) less dry. <i>Revitalize your face <b>moisturize</b> your skin.</i>
<b>muted</b>	(of a musical instrument) having a muffled sound as a result of being fitted with a mute. <i><b>Muted</b> anger.</i>
<b>pigskin</b>	Leather made from pigskin. <i>A pair of black <b>pigskin</b> gloves.</i>
<b>quiet</b>	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>We wanted a <b>quiet</b> wedding.</i>
<b>rolling</b>	Propelling something on wheels. <i>He was charged with <b>rolling</b> drunks in the park.</i>
<b>secretly</b>	In secrecy; not openly. <i>I was embarrassed but <b>secretly</b> pleased too.</i>
<b><u>sliding</u></b>	Being a smooth continuous motion. <i><b>Sliding</b> TV ratings.</i>

<b>snow</b>	Falls of snow. <i>The first <b>snows</b> of winter.</i>
<b>snowball</b>	Throw snowballs at. <i>The campaign was <b>snowballing</b>.</i>
<b>snowy</b>	(of weather or a period of time) characterized by snowfall. <i>A long <b>snowy</b> winter.</i>
<b>soft</b>	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music soft in a quiet subdued tone. <i><b>Soft</b> data.</i>
<b>stealthily</b>	In a cautious and surreptitious manner, so as not to be seen or heard. <i>We need to move <b>stealthily</b> and look inconspicuous.</i>
<b>subdued</b>	Not brilliant or glaring. <i>I felt strangely <b>subdued</b> as I drove home.</i>
<b>velvety</b>	Smooth and soft to sight or hearing or touch or taste. <i>Robes of <b>velvety</b> black.</i>
<a href="#"><u>whisper</u></a>	A soft or confidential tone of voice a whispered word or phrase. <i>He managed to <b>whisper</b> a faint goodbye.</i>
<b>whispering</b>	Speaking softly without vibration of the vocal cords.
<b>white</b>	Of wine made from white grapes or dark grapes with the skins removed and having a yellowish colour. <i>He was dressed from head to foot in <b>white</b>.</i>
