### Definitions of "Mug" as a noun

- countenance** Support or approval.  
*She was giving her specific **countenance** to the occasion.*

*Men who were simply the **dupes** of their unscrupulous leaders.*
- face** The side upon which the use of a thing depends usually the most prominent surface of an object.

<b>features</b>	The characteristic parts of a person's face: eyes and nose and mouth and chin. <i>The map showed roads and other <b>features</b>.</i>
<b>fool</b>	A person who acts unwisely or imprudently; a silly person. <i>He is the <b>fool</b> of circumstances.</i>
<b>gull</b>	A person who is gullible and easy to take advantage of.
<b>innocent</b>	A pure, guileless, or naive person. <i>They are prepared to kill or maim <b>innocents</b> in pursuit of a cause.</i>
<b>kisser</b>	The human face kisser and smiler and mug are informal terms for face and phiz is British. <i>I belted him one right on the <b>kisser</b>.</i>
<b>mark</b>	A figure or letter representing the total number of marks awarded in an examination or competition and signifying a person's score. <i>The first syllable has a stress <b>mark</b>.</i>
<b>mugful</b>	The quantity that can be held in a mug.
<b>patsy</b>	A person who is gullible and easy to take advantage of. <i>There is a mischievous sparkle in his eyes that suggests he is no <b>patsy</b>.</i>
<b>phiz</b>	The human face kisser and smiler and mug are informal terms for face and phiz is British. <i>It was enough to paste his <b>phiz</b> on the cover of Time magazine.</i>
<b>physiognomy</b>	A person's facial features or expression, especially when regarded as indicative of character or ethnic origin. <i>The <b>physiognomy</b> of the landscape.</i>
<b><u>simpleton</u></b>	A person lacking intelligence or common sense. <i>Stop grinning at me like a <b>simpleton</b>.</i>
<b>smiler</b>	The human face kisser and smiler and mug are informal terms for face and phiz is British.
<b>sucker</b>	Flesh of any of numerous North American food fishes with toothless jaws. <i>The <b>suckers</b> run along each tentacle.</i>
<b><u>visage</u></b>	A person's face, with reference to the form or proportions of the features. <i>The moonlit <b>visage</b> of the port's whitewashed buildings.</i>

### Definitions of "Mug" as a verb

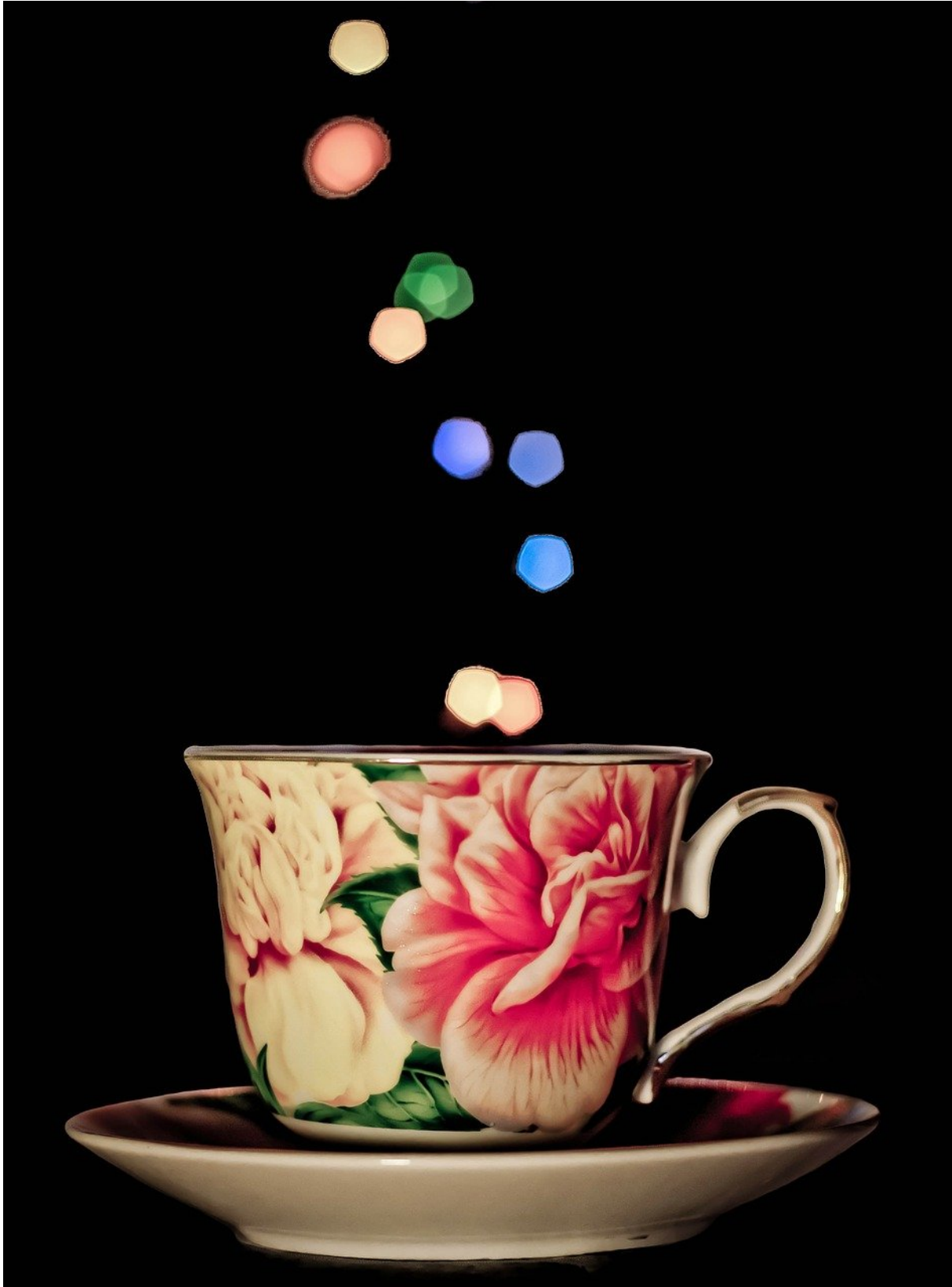
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "mug" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Make faces, especially silly or exaggerated ones, before an audience or a camera.*
- *Rob at gunpoint or with the threat of violence.*
- *Attack and rob (someone) in a public place.*



## Synonyms of "Mug" as a verb (6 Words)

- assault** Make a physical attack on.  
*They left their strong position to **assault** the hill.*
- attack** Launch an attack or assault on begin hostilities or start warfare with.  
*The cancer cells are **attacking** his liver.*
- beat up** Come out better in a competition, race, or conflict.
- knock down** Make light, repeated taps on a surface.
- rob** Steal.  
*Someone had **robbed** my jacket.*
- set upon** Put into a certain place or abstract location.

## Associations of "Mug" (30 Words)

<b>bottle</b>	The quantity contained in a bottle. <i>The wine was <b>bottled</b> in 1997.</i>
<b>carafe</b>	An open-topped glass flask used for serving wine or water in a restaurant. <i>A <b>carafe</b> of retsina.</i>
<b>ceramic</b>	The art of making ceramic articles. <i>Many of the painted <b>ceramics</b> are of native manufacture.</i>
<b>chalice</b>	A large cup or goblet.



<b>chinaware</b>	Dishware made of high quality porcelain.
<b>clay</b>	A hardened clay surface for a tennis court. <i>The rocks are covered by various mixtures of loose <b>clays</b> and sands.</i>
<b>coffee</b>	Any of several small trees and shrubs native to the tropical Old World yielding coffee beans. <i>We went out for a <b>coffee</b>.</i>
<b>crockery</b>	Tableware (eating and serving dishes) collectively.
<b>cup</b>	Cup shaped plant organ. <i>He wore a jock strap with a metal <b>cup</b>.</i>
<b>earthen</b>	(of a pot) made of baked or fired clay. <i>On shelves sat <b>earthen</b> jugs.</i>
<b>earthenware</b>	Ceramic ware made of porous clay fired at low heat. <i>An <b>earthenware</b> jug.</i>
<b>ewer</b>	A large jug with a wide mouth, formerly used for carrying water.
<b>figurine</b>	A statuette, especially one of a human form.
<b>goblet</b>	A metal or glass bowl-shaped drinking cup, sometimes with a foot and a cover. <i>A beautifully engraved crystal <b>goblet</b>.</i>
<b>gourd</b>	Bottle made from the dried shell of a bottle gourd.
<b>jar</b>	The quantity contained in a jar. <i>This play <b>jarred</b> the audience.</i>
<b>kiln</b>	A furnace for firing or burning or drying such things as porcelain or bricks.
<b>pitcher</b>	The modified leaf of a pitcher plant. <i>He has played every position except <b>pitcher</b>.</i>
<b>porcelain</b>	Porcelain articles collectively. <i>A <b>porcelain</b> bowl.</i>
<b>pottery</b>	The craft or profession of making pottery. <i>Courses include drawing painting and <b>pottery</b>.</i>
<b>scurry</b>	To move about or proceed hurriedly. <i>The sled disappeared in a <b>scurry</b> of snow.</i>
<b>silverware</b>	Tableware made of silver or silver plate or pewter or stainless steel.
<b>statuette</b>	A small statue or figurine, especially one that is smaller than life-size.
<b>stein</b>	A mug intended for serving beer.
<b>tableware</b>	Articles for use at the table (dishes and silverware and glassware).
<b>tumbler</b>	A gymnast who performs rolls and somersaults and twists etc.

**urn** An ornamental sculpture shaped like an urn.  
*A weathered stone **urn**.*

**vase** A decorative container without handles, typically made of glass or china and used as an ornament or for displaying cut flowers.

**vitri** Change into glass or a glass-like substance by applying heat.  
*The option of **vitri**ing nuclear waste presents problems.*
