| diversity                  | The practice or quality of including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds and of different genders, sexual orientations, etc.<br><i>Equality and <b>diversity</b> should be supported for their own sake.</i>  |
| eclectic                   | Someone who selects according to the eclectic method.<br><i>Universities offering an <b>eclectic</b> mix of courses.</i>  |
| heterogeneous              | Incommensurable through being of different kinds, degrees, or dimensions.<br><i><b>Heterogeneous</b> catalysis.</i>   |
| hexagon                    | A plane figure with six straight sides and angles.  |
| itemize                    | Present as a list of individual items.<br><i>An <b>itemized</b> bill.</i>   |
| manifold                   | A pipe or chamber branching into several openings.<br><i>Our <b>manifold</b> failings.</i>  |

| <b>pluralism</b>     | The practice of holding more than one ecclesiastical office at a time.   |
| <b>polygon</b>       | A plane figure with at least three straight sides and angles, and typically five or more.  |
| <b>potpourri</b>     | A mixture or medley of things.<br>He played a <b>potpourri</b> of tunes from Gilbert and Sullivan.   |
| <b>protean</b>       | Taking on different forms.<br>Eyes of that baffling <b>protean</b> grey which is never twice the same.   |
| <b>sundry</b>        | Various items not important enough to be mentioned individually.<br><b>Sundry</b> sciences commonly known as social.                             |
| <b>type</b>          | Determine the type to which a person or their blood or tissue belongs.<br>The word element contains five different <b>types</b> of character.    |
| <b>varied</b>        | Incorporating a number of different types or elements; showing variation or variety.<br>Her quickly <b>varied</b> answers indicated uncertainty. |
