- *The product of a quantity by an integer.*

cash and carry Money in the form of bills or coins.

outlet An organization that broadcasts or publishes journalism.
*She had no other **outlet** for her feelings.*

reseller A person or company that sells something they have bought to someone else.
*Products are sold both directly and through **resellers**.*

retail outlet The selling of goods to consumers; usually in small quantities and not for resale.

retail store The selling of goods to consumers; usually in small quantities and not for resale.

store A shop selling basic necessities.
***Storehouses** were built close to the docks.*

Definitions of "Multiple" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "multiple" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a disease, injury, etc.) complex in its nature or effects; affecting several parts of the body.*
- *Having or involving or consisting of more than one part or entity or individual.*
- *Numerous and often varied.*
- *Having or involving several parts, elements, or members.*



Synonyms of "Multiple" as an adjective (13 Words)

<u>collective</u>	Forming a whole or aggregate. <i>The collective power of the workforce.</i>
<u>compound</u>	Composed of more than one part <i>compound flower heads.</i> Compound leaves are composed of several lobes.
different	Distinct or separate. <i>Each interviewed different members of the community.</i>
diverse	Many and different. <i>A person of diverse talents.</i>
manifold	Many and various. <i>The implications of this decision were manifold.</i>
many	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `as' or `too' or `so' or `that'; amounting to a large but indefinite number. <i>Never saw so many people.</i>
miscellaneous	Having many aspects or qualities. <i>Miscellaneous accessories.</i>
multifarious	Having many aspects. <i>Multifarious activities.</i>
multitudinous	Very numerous. <i>The multitudinous array of chemical substances that exist in the natural world.</i>
numerous	Consisting of many members. <i>The orchestra and chorus were numerous.</i>
<u>several</u>	(used with count nouns) of an indefinite number more than 2 or 3 but not many. <i>The two levels of government sort out their several responsibilities.</i>
sundry	Consisting of a haphazard assortment of different kinds. <i>Sundry sciences commonly known as social.</i>
<u>various</u>	Of many different kinds purposefully arranged but lacking any uniformity. <i>Cited various reasons for his behavior.</i>

billion	Denoting a quantity consisting of one million million items or units in Great Britain.
double	To double the degree. <i>A double binary star.</i>
doubled	Twice as great or many. <i>The dose is doubled.</i>
doubly	To double the degree. <i>She was doubly rewarded.</i>
dual	In an aircraft using dual controls. <i>Dual controls for pilot and copilot.</i>
four	A playing card or domino or die whose upward face shows four pips.
fourth	In the fourth place. <i>Fourthly you must pay the rent on the first of the month.</i>

manifold	A lightweight paper used with carbon paper to make multiple copies. <i>The exhaust manifold.</i>
number	Mark with a number or assign a number to typically to indicate position in a series. <i>Each document was numbered consecutively.</i>
numeral	Of or relating to or denoting numbers. <i>He learned to write the numerals before he went to school.</i>
pirouette	Do a pirouette usually as part of a dance. <i>She pirouetted and made a bow.</i>
plural	A plural word or form. <i>The first person plural.</i>
quadruple	A quadruple number or amount. <i>Quadruplex wire.</i>
quartet	A composition for a quartet. <i>A Beethoven quartet.</i>
redouble	Double a bid already doubled by an opponent. <i>We will redouble our efforts to reform agricultural policy.</i>
sextuple	Multiply by six; increase sixfold.
six	A playing card or domino or die whose upward face shows six pips.
ten	One of four playing cards in a deck with ten pips on the face.
ternary	Composed of three parts. <i>A ternary operation.</i>
three	One of four playing cards in a deck having three pips.
times	An arithmetic operation that is the inverse of division; the product of two numbers is computed. <i>You times the six by four to get twenty four.</i>
triad	A member of a Triad. <i>The triad of medication diet and exercise are necessary in diabetes care.</i>
trillion	The number that is represented as a one followed by 18 zeros. <i>In England they call a quintillion a trillion.</i>
trinity	A group of three people or things. <i>God is said to be trinity in unity.</i>
trio	A group of three musicians. <i>A jazz trio.</i>
triple	Hit a triple. <i>A triple murder.</i>

- triplicate** One of three copies; any of three things that correspond to one another exactly.
Triplicate measurements.
- twice** Two times; on two occasions.
*The earl married **twice**.*
- twofold** Twice as great or many.
*The price increased **twofold** last year.*
- variously** In several or different ways.
*The alternatives that are **variously** represented by the participants.*
