rugged	Sturdy and strong in constitution or construction; enduring. <i>A rugged competitive examination.</i>
sinewy	Consisting of tendons or resembling a tendon. <i>The language is spare and sinewy.</i>
strapping	Muscular and heavily built. <i>A strapping boy of eighteen.</i>

strong	Relating to or denoting the strongest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts between nucleons and other hadrons when closer than about 10 cm so binding protons in a nucleus despite the repulsion due to their charge and which conserves strangeness parity and isospin. <i>He was not a strong swimmer.</i>

<u>sturdy</u>	Having rugged physical strength; inured to fatigue or hardships. <i>He had a sturdy muscular physique.</i>
tendinous	Consisting of or resembling tendons. <i>A band of muscular and tendinous fibres.</i>
<u>tough</u>	Physically toughened. <i>A tough character.</i>
<u>twitch</u>	Use a twitch to subdue a horse. <i>Her lips twitched and her eyelids fluttered.</i>
<u>valiant</u>	Possessing or showing courage or determination. <i>She made a valiant effort to hold her anger in check.</i>
