#### Definitions of "Musician" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "musician" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- Someone who plays a musical instrument (as a profession.
- A person who plays a musical instrument, especially as a profession, or is musically talented.
- Artist who composes or conducts music as a profession.





## Synonyms of "Musician" as a noun (8 Words)

accompanist	A person who provides a musical accompaniment to another musician or to a singer.
conductor	The person who collects fares on a public conveyance. <i>He was appointed principal conductor of the Berlin Symphony</i> <i>Orchestra.</i>
instrumentalist	A player of a musical instrument. Is the skilled pop <b>instrumentalist</b> an endangered species.
maestro	A distinguished figure in any sphere. A Vietnam vet turned movie <b>maestro</b> .
performer	An entertainer who performs a dramatic or musical work for an audience. <i>A circus performer.</i>
<u>player</u>	A device for playing recorded music or video. She knows Harry is something of a <b>player</b> .



soloist	A musician or singer who performs a solo. He appears as a concerto <b>soloist</b> with all the great British orchestras.
virtuoso	A musician who is a consummate master of technique and artistry. <i>Virtuoso guitar playing.</i>



### Usage Examples of "Musician" as a noun

- Aspiring rock and pop musicians. Your father was a fine musician.





# Associations of "Musician" (30 Words)

<u>acting</u>	The art or occupation of performing fictional roles in plays, films, or television. She studied <b>acting</b> in New York.
actor	A person whose profession is acting on the stage, in films, or on television. <i>He s a principal <b>actor</b> in this affair</i> .
audition	Perform an audition. I <b>audition</b> ed and was lucky enough to get the part.
blues	A piece of blues music. He had a bad case of the <b>blues</b> .
comedian	A professional performer who tells jokes and performs comical acts. <i>A stand up <b>comedian</b>.</i>



composer	Someone who composes music as a profession. <i>Mozart was her favourite <b>composer</b>.</i>
conductor	A person who directs the performance of an orchestra or choir. Most polymers are poor <b>conductor</b> s.
entertainer	A person, such as a singer, dancer, or comedian, whose job is to entertain others. She is one of Hollywood s highest paid <b>entertainer</b> s.
guitar	A stringed instrument usually having six strings; played by strumming or plucking.
<u>instrument</u>	Equip with instruments for measuring recording or controlling. <i>He was a mere instrument acting under coercion.</i>
instrumentalist	An adherent of instrumentalism. Is the skilled pop <b>instrumentalist</b> an endangered species.
lyricist	A person who writes the words for songs.
minstrel	Celebrate by singing in the style of minstrels. They listened to the <b>minstrel</b> s singing songs of knightly prowess.
music	Music the sounds produced by singers or musical instruments or reproductions of such sounds. <i>Couples were dancing to the <b>music</b>.</i>
musicologist	An expert in or student of music as an academic subject, as opposed to someone trained in performance or composition.
novelist	A writer of novels.
percussion	The act of playing a percussion instrument. <i>Percussion</i> instruments.
performance	The action or process of performing a task or function. It was a tremendous all round <b>performance</b> by Wigan.
performer	An entertainer who performs a dramatic or musical work for an audience. <i>A circus performer</i> .
pianist	A person who plays the piano, especially professionally.
piano	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music. <i>The <b>piano</b> passages in the composition.</i>
<u>singer</u>	A person who sings. A pop <b>singer</b> .
<u>solo</u>	A bid by which a player undertakes to win five tricks in solo whist. <i>His first ride in his aircraft would also be his first <b>solo</b>.</i>
song	A musical composition suggestive of a song. <i>He bought it for a <b>song</b>.</i>



<u>studio</u>	A studio flat. The music department provided <b>studio</b> s for their students.
stunt	Perform a stunt or stunts. Some weeds produce chemicals that <b>stunt</b> the plant s growth.
<u>theater</u>	The art of writing and producing plays. <i>He served in the Vietnam <b>theater</b> for three years.</i>
vaudeville	A light or comic stage play with interspersed songs. A stage show with <b>vaudeville</b> acts and dancing girls.
violinist	A musician who plays the violin. The most renowned virtuoso <b>violinist</b> of his time.
woodwind	Any wind instrument other than the brass instruments. <i>A <b>woodwind</b> instrument.</i>
