- Be obliged to; should (expressing necessity.
- Used in ironic questions expressing irritation.
- Expressing insistence.
- Expressing an opinion about something that is logically very likely.

be required to Be identical to; be someone or something.

be under an obligation to Be identical or equivalent to.

have got to Have as a feature.

have to Organize or be responsible for.need to Require as useful, just, or proper.
