- deviant** A deviant person or thing.  
*Killers **deviants** and those whose actions are beyond most human comprehension.*
- freak** A person regarded as strange because of their unusual appearance or behaviour.  
*A few **freaks** have been discovered one amazing cat tipping the scales at no less than 43 lbs.*
- freak of nature** Someone who is so ardently devoted to something that it resembles an addiction.
- monster** An inhumanly cruel or wicked person.  
*He was an unfeeling treacherous **monster**.*
- monstrosity** A thing, especially a building, which is very large and unsightly.  
*Had my tone of reason in the face of **monstrosity** finally registered.*

<b><u>mutation</u></b>	A distinct form resulting from genetic mutation. <i>His first novel went through several <b>mutations</b>.</i>
<b>oddy</b>	A strange or peculiar person or thing. <i>She was regarded as a bit of an <b>oddy</b>.</i>
<b>sport</b>	Someone who engages in sports. <i>I have heard there is good <b>sport</b> to be had in Buttermere.</i>
<b><u>variant</u></b>	Something a little different from others of the same type. <i>Clinically distinct <b>variants</b> of malaria.</i>
<b>variation</b>	A version of a theme, modified in melody, rhythm, harmony, or ornamentation, so as to present it in a new but still recognizable form. <i>Hurling is an Irish <b>variation</b> of hockey.</i>





## Usage Examples of "Mutant" as a noun

- *Frequently only a small percentage of the offspring of mutants resemble their parents.*



## Associations of "Mutant" (30 Words)

<b>abruptly</b>	Steeply; precipitously. <i>The film ends rather <b>abruptly</b>.</i>
<b><u>alter</u></b>	Make an alteration to. <i>This dress needs to be <b>altered</b>.</i>
<b><u>alteration</u></b>	The act of making something different (as e.g. the size of a garment). <i><b>Alterations</b> had to be made.</i>
<b>change</b>	Undergo a change become different in essence losing one's or its original nature. <i>Electronic cigarettes use liquid nicotine which <b>changes</b> into vapour when heated.</i>



<b>changed</b>	Changed in constitution or structure or composition by metamorphism. <i>A greatly <b>changed</b> country after the war.</i>
<b>correction</b>	A change that rectifies an error or inaccuracy. <i>I checked the typing for errors and sent it back for <b>correction</b>.</i>
<b>corrigible</b>	Capable of being corrected, rectified, or reformed. <i>A <b>corrigible</b> prisoner.</i>
<b><u>defective</u></b>	(of a word) not having all the inflections normal for the part of speech. <i>A <b>defective</b> appliance.</i>
<b>deficiency</b>	A failing or shortcoming. <i>A budget <b>deficiency</b> of 96 billion.</i>
<b>deform</b>	Become distorted or misshapen undergo deformation. <i>The heat <b>deformed</b> the plastic sculpture.</i>
<b><u>deformed</u></b>	So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly. <i>His <b>deformed</b> hands.</i>
<b>disfigure</b>	Mar or spoil the appearance of. <i>Litter <b>disfigures</b> the countryside.</i>
<b><u>distorted</u></b>	Affected by electrical distortion. <i><b>Distorted</b> guitars.</i>
<b><u>error</u></b>	A measure of the estimated difference between the observed or calculated value of a quantity and its true value. <i>Spelling <b>errors</b>.</i>
<b>failing</b>	Below acceptable in performance. <i>Received <b>failing</b> grades.</i>
<b>flaw</b>	Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective. <i>There were fundamental <b>flaws</b> in the case for reforming local government.</i>
<b><u>flawed</u></b>	Having or characterized by a fundamental weakness or imperfection. <i>A <b>flawed</b> hero.</i>
<b>mistake</b>	To make a mistake or be incorrect. <i>Don't <b>mistake</b> her for her twin sister.</i>
<b><u>modification</u></b>	The act of making something different (as e.g. the size of a garment). <i>The neighborhood had undergone few <b>modifications</b> since his last visit years ago.</i>
<b>modified</b>	Mediocre. <i>The performance of the <b>modified</b> aircraft was much improved.</i>
<b>mutate</b>	Change in form or nature. <i>Cells <b>mutate</b>.</i>

<b>phenotype</b>	The set of observable characteristics of an individual resulting from the interaction of its genotype with the environment.
<b>revision</b>	A revised edition or form of something. <i>The scheme needs drastic <b>revision</b>.</i>
<b>stumble</b>	An unsteady uneven gait. <i>She <b>stumbled</b> over the words.</i>
<b>suddenly</b>	Happening unexpectedly. <i>He stopped <b>suddenly</b>.</i>
<b>transformation</b>	A metamorphosis during the life cycle of an animal. <i>British society underwent a radical <b>transformation</b>.</i>
<b>transformed</b>	Given a completely different form or appearance. <i>Shocked to see the <b>transformed</b> landscape.</i>
<u><b>variant</b></u>	Something a little different from others of the same type. <i>A <b>variant</b> spelling.</i>
<b>variation</b>	Any perturbation of the mean motion or orbit of a planet or satellite (especially a perturbation of the earth's moon). <i>Who is responsible for these <b>variations</b> in taxation.</i>
<u><b>varied</b></u>	Incorporating a number of different types or elements; showing variation or variety. <i>A long and <b>varied</b> career.</i>
