#### Definitions of "Mystical" as an adjective


According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "mystical" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Relating to or resembling mysticism.
- Relating to mystics or religious mysticism.
- Concerned with the soul or the spirit, rather than with material things.
- Having a spiritual symbolic or allegorical significance that transcends human understanding.
- Relating to ancient religious mysteries or other occult or esoteric rites.
- Of hidden or esoteric meaning.
- Inspiring a sense of spiritual mystery, awe, and fascination.
- Having an import not apparent to the senses nor obvious to the intelligence; beyond



ordinary understanding.

• Relating to or characteristic of mysticism.

baffling	Impossible to understand; perplexing. A <b>baffling</b> problem.
bewildering	Confusing or perplexing. There is a <b>bewildering</b> array of holidays to choose from.
bizarre	Conspicuously or grossly unconventional or unusual. A <b>bizarre</b> situation.



confusing	Causing confusion or disorientation. He found being in Egypt very <b>confusing</b> .
curious	Eager to know or learn something. A trap door that made me <b>curious</b> .
dark	Having a dark hue. A tall <b>dark</b> girl.
delphic	Of or relating to Delphi or to the oracles of Apollo at Delphi.
<u>emblematic</u>	Serving as a symbol of a particular quality or concept; symbolic. This case is <b>emblematic</b> of a larger problem.
exceptional	Unusual; not typical. <i>Exceptional</i> kindness.
extraordinary	(of an official) serving an unusual or special function in addition to those of the regular officials. An <b>extraordinary</b> desire for approval.
extrasensory	Seemingly outside normal sensory channels.
figurative	(of an artist or work of art) representing forms that are recognizably derived from life. <i>Figurative</i> language.
funny	Experiencing odd bodily sensations. Suddenly my stomach felt <b>funny</b> .
impenetrable	Permitting little if any light to pass through because of denseness of matter. An <b>impenetrable</b> fortress.
incomprehensible	Difficult to understand- A. Einstein. The most <b>incomprehensible</b> thing about the universe is that it is comprehensible.
<u>inexplicable</u>	Incapable of being explained or accounted for. For some <b>inexplicable</b> reason her mind went completely blank.
insoluble	Admitting of no solution or explanation. Once dry the paints become <b>insoluble</b> in water.
magic	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare. A <b>magic</b> al spell.
<u>magical</u>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. It was a <b>magical</b> evening of pure nostalgia.



metaphorical	Characteristic of or relating to metaphor; figurative. Many of our <b>metaphorical</b> expressions develop from our perceptions of the body.
<u>metaphysical</u>	Of or characteristic of the metaphysical poets. Good and Evil are inextricably linked in a <b>metaphysical</b> battle across space and time.
mysterious	Having an import not apparent to the senses nor obvious to the intelligence; beyond ordinary understanding. The new insurance policy is written without cryptic or <b>mysterious</b> terms.
<u>mystic</u>	Relating to or characteristic of mysticism. <i>Mystic</i> al religion.
mystifying	Of an obscure nature. A <b>mystifying</b> phenomenon.
<u>obscure</u>	Not clearly understood or expressed-Anatole Broyard- P.A.So. I feel an <b>obscure</b> resentment.
<u>occult</u>	Communicated only to the initiated; esoteric. An <b>occult</b> ceremony.
<u>odd</u>	Different to what is usual or expected; strange. It s <b>odd</b> that she didn t recognize me.
orphic	Having an import not apparent to the senses nor obvious to the intelligence; beyond ordinary understanding.
out of the ordinary	v Outer or outlying.
outstanding	Owed as a debt. Einstein was one of the <b>outstanding</b> figures of the 20th centurey.
parabolic	Resembling or expressed by parables. A <b>parabolic</b> mirror behind a spotlight projects a parallel beam.
paranormal	Seemingly outside normal sensory channels. What seemed to be <b>paranormal</b> manifestations.
peculiar	Markedly different from the usual-Virginia Woolf. Some languages are <b>peculiar</b> to one region.
perplexing	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. A <b>perplexing</b> problem.
<u>phenomenal</u>	Perceptible by the senses or through immediate experience. The <b>phenomenal</b> world.
preternatural	Existing outside of or not in accordance with nature-Aldous Huxley. <i>Autumn had arrived with preternatural speed.</i>



<u>puzzling</u>	Not clear to the understanding. A <b>puzzling</b> statement.
<u>rare</u>	Recurring only at long intervals. Lightheaded from the <b>rare</b> fied mountain air.
remarkable	Worthy of notice. A <b>remarkable</b> achievement.
representative	Being or characteristic of government by representation in which citizens exercise power through elected officers and representatives. <i>The bust involves a high degree of <b>representative</b> abstraction.</i>
secret	Given in confidence or in secret. A <b>secret</b> drinker.
sibylline	Relating to or characteristic of a sibyl; prophetic and mysterious. One glimpses them uttering <b>sibylline</b> predictions of weal and woe.
signal	Notably out of the ordinary. The year saw one <b>signal</b> triumph for the Labour party.
<u>singular</u>	Relating to or of the nature of singularity. She always thought of herself as <b>singular</b> as his only daughter.
strange	Being definitely out of the ordinary and unexpected; slightly odd or even a bit weird. A <b>strange</b> exaltation that was indefinable.
supernatural	Not existing in nature or subject to explanation according to natural laws; not physical or material. <i>A woman of <b>supernatural</b> beauty.</i>
supernormal	Beyond the range of the normal or scientifically explainable. Years of <b>supernormal</b> employment during the war.
<u>symbolic</u>	Serving as a visible symbol for something abstract. <i>Symbolic</i> operations.
transcendental	Existing outside of or not in accordance with nature-Aldous Huxley. The <b>transcendental</b> importance of each person s soul.
unaccountable	Unable to be explained. A strange and <b>unaccountable</b> fact.
uncanny	Strange or mysterious, especially in an unsettling way. An <b>uncanny</b> feeling that she was being watched.
uncommon	Marked by an uncommon quality especially superlative or extreme of its kind J R Lowell. <i>He owed his greatest debt to his mother s <b>uncommon</b> character and ability.</i>



<u>unexplainable</u>	Not to be accounted for or explained. <i>He was subject to <b>unexplainable</b> rages.</i>
<u>unfathomable</u>	(of water or a natural feature) impossible to measure the extent of. <i>Her grey eyes were dark with some</i> <b>unfathomable</b> <i>emotion.</i>
unprecedented	Never done or known before. The government took the <b>unprecedented</b> step of releasing confidential correspondence.
unusual	Remarkable or interesting because different from or better than others. <i>A man of <b>unusual</b> talent.</i>
<u>weird</u>	Strikingly odd or unusual- Bram Stoker. <b>Weird</b> inhuman sounds.

<u>atheist</u>	Someone who denies the existence of god. <i>He is a committed <b>atheist</b>.</i>



<u>aura</u>	(in spiritualism and some forms of alternative medicine) a supposed emanation surrounding the body of a living creature and regarded as an essential part of the individual. <i>Emotional mental and spiritual levels form an energy field around the body</i> <i>known as the</i> <b>aura</b> .
believing	The cognitive process that leads to convictions. <i>Seeing is <b>believing</b></i> .
bible	The sacred writings of the Christian religions.
blaspheme	Speak of in an irreverent or impious manner. He has <b>blaspheme</b> d against the Holy Spirit.
consecrate	Appoint to a clerical posts. The <b>consecrate</b> d chapel.
deify	Consider as a god or godlike. These young men <b>deify</b> financial success.
deist	A person who believes that God created the universe and then abandoned it.
deity	The creator and supreme being (in a monotheistic religion such as Christianity. <i>A ruler driven by delusions of <b>deity</b>.</i>
dionysus	(Greek mythology) god of wine and fertility and drama; the Greek name of Bacchus.
<u>divinity</u>	The quality of being divine. Ancient Egyptians believed in the <b>divinity</b> of the Pharaohs.
<b>heavenly</b>	Relating to or inhabiting a divine heaven. <i>Heavenly</i> hosts.
<u>heretic</u>	A person who holds religious beliefs in conflict with the dogma of the Roman Catholic Church.
idolatrous	Relating to or practicing idolatry. <i>Idolatrous</i> religions.
<u>mystic</u>	Relating to or characteristic of mysticism. <i>Mystic</i> al theories about the securities market.
<u>occult</u>	Become concealed or hidden from view or have its light extinguished. <i>A secret society to study alchemy and the <b>occult</b>.</i>
omniscience	The state of knowing everything. <i>The notion of divine <b>omniscience</b></i> .
orison	A prayer.
pantheistic	Of or relating to pantheism.



A group of particularly respected, famous, or important people. <i>The deities of the Hindu <b>pantheon</b></i> .
Revive or revitalize (something that is inactive, disused, or forgotten. <i>He</i> <b>resurrect</b> ed the tango in this remote part of Argentina.
Must be kept sacred. The individual s right to work has been upheld as <b>sacrosanct</b> .
Infuse with spirit. <i>Spirits of turpentine.</i>
A thing regarded as holy or likened to a temple especially a person s body. <i>The veins in his temple throbbed.</i>
Belief in the existence of a god or gods, specifically of a creator who intervenes in the universe. There are many different forms of <b>theism</b> .
Someone who is learned in theology or who speculates about theology.
Relating to the study of the nature of God and religious belief. A reworking of the past that was partly <b>theological</b> .
The study of the nature of God and religious belief. <i>Roman Catholic <b>theology</b></i> .
