governess	(especially in former times) a woman employed to teach children in a private household.	
nanny-goat	Female goat.	
nurse	A wet nurse. Her mother s old nurse .	
nursemaid	A woman who is the custodian of children.	
nursery nurse A child's room for a baby.		
she-goat	Female goat.

Definitions of "Nanny" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "nanny" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Be overprotective towards.
- Work as a nanny.





Synonyms of "Nanny" as a verb (7 Words)

baby	Treat someone as a baby pamper or be overprotective towards. <i>Her aunt babied her and fussed over her clothes.</i>
be overprotective towards	Be priced at.
<u>coddle</u>	Treat with excessive indulgence. <i>Let s not mollycoddle our students.</i>
cosset	Care for and protect in an overindulgent way. All her life she d been cosset ed by her family.
mollycoddle	Treat (someone) in an indulgent or overprotective way. <i>Let s not mollycoddle our students.</i>
nursemaid	Look after or be overprotective towards. I haven t got time to nursemaid you through these problems.
wait on hand and foot	Serve as a waiter or waitress in a restaurant.

- She cooked, cleaned, and nannied for a family in California.
